General Manager Horn of N. P. Issues Ultimatum Stating That Men Can Either Accept Terms of Settlement or Quit.

St. Paul, Aug. 1.—Shortly before noon today General Manager Horn of the Northern Pacific Railroad sent an order to the telegraph operators employed by the system, from St. Paul to the coast, that they could accept the terms of settlement of the wage question or they could quit. The company's terms are: (1) The men are to be paid 80 per cent of the rate of the telegraphers' union; (2) The men are to be paid 10 per cent of the rate of the telegraphers' union; (3) The men are to be paid 10 per cent of the rate of the telegraphers' union.

NEW BELT LINE FOR CLEVELAND. Will Meet the Greter of Steel Industry.

Cleveland, O., Aug. 1.—It is announced that the belt line railroad to encircle this city and run from Fairport on the east to the river on the west, a distance of approximately 100 miles, has been financed and construction work will start as soon as the necessary permits are obtained. The project is the largest ever launched in Cleveland and will require about two years to complete.
