Boston, Sept. 14.—The death of Mayor Patrick A. Collins at Hot Springs, Va., was announced here today by M. J. Curran, secretary to the Mayor. A telegram received by Mr. Curran briefly reported the sudden demise of his chief.

Mayor Collins was one of the leading Democrats in his country. He served in Congress from 1887 to 1889, and was United States Consul General in London, 1897-7. Mayor Collins was regarded here as one of the last members of the so-called "old school" in national life.

TRUANT OFFICER STAFF REORGANIZED


