Washington, Oct. 1.—In correspondence between President Roosevelt and Assistant Secretary of State Loomis, published here tonight, the President says that Secretary Hay disagreed with him on "even mild censure" of Bowen.

LOOMIS'S LETTER. Department of State, Washington, D. C., Sept. 25, 1905. Mr. President, I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 23rd inst.
