

SIXTY-FIVE REPUBLICANS REVOLT AGAINST CANNON'S DICTATION ON STATEHOOD

Tawney Leads Attack on Omnibus Bill, Saying He Is Irrevocably Opposed to Such a Measure.

The Republic Bureau. Washington, Dec. 14.—Sixty-five members of the House of Representatives, led by James A. Tawney, chairman of the Committee on Appropriations, to-day in caucus held the banner of revolt against Speaker Cannon and the administration on statehood legislation.
