Anniversary of the Great Clash in Scotland's Fierce Fight for Liberty—The Cause That Led Up to It.

Today is the anniversary of the battle of Bannockburn, which in the eyes of Scotsmen ranks with Marathon and Morgarten as the greatest patriotic battles of the world.

These untoward events brought the great Celtic royalty of Scotland to be represented only by King Alexander and the sickly infant princess of Norway, and the Scottish estates (parliament) was convened to decide as to the succession, which in the meantime was settled on the maid of Norway and the king urged to re-marry.

On March 19th, the following year, he attended a council of state in Edinburgh castle, promising to join the queen at Burslem in the evening.

When found by his attendants life had left the bruised and battered form, and the dynasty which with little interruption had ruled Scotland wisely and well for nearly five centuries, came practically to an end.

The cloud of dark foreboding which started from the deathbed of Prince Alexander now enshrouded the entire land in gloom, with only one feeble ray of hopeful light gleaming from distant Norway, where the frail life of a sickly child formed the only barrier to Scotland becoming a prize to be contested for by Norman barons, who claimed her for their inheritance through descent in the female line from her native monarchs.

Shortly afterwards the Scots avidly grasped the proposal of Edward, of England to wed their queen by the first heir to the English throne, who bore the title of Prince of Wales, afterwards Edward II.

The long-dreaded predicament had now arrived and the Scottish estates convened to decide which Norman baron should be their ruler.

On June 23, 1294, having one day to spare, the English army was "flashing with steel and rough with gold."
