MURDERERS WILL BE TRIED

AT THE COMING SESSION OF THE SUPERIOR CRIMINAL COURT.

Court Will Convene Next Tuesday—Many Cases to be Disposed of This Term—The Docket Unusually Lengthy—Other Court News of Interest.

The July term of the superior court, criminal side, will come to next Tuesday with Judge Robinson of Middletown on the bench. There are an unusually large number of prisoners in the county jail awaiting trial at this term of the court, while there are also a large number out on bonds, and altogether it is expected that the term will be an unusually protracted one.

The court will come in Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, when the prisoners will be put to plea. Wednesday the petty jury will be summoned and the regular business of the term commenced. There will also be a grand jury summoned in to pass upon the cases of Luigi Di Capria, who is charged with murder in the first degree for killing Alfonso Calzillo on April 4, 1895, on Wallace street by stabbing, and of Daniel F. Early, who is also charged with murder in the first degree for killing Lyman M. Penn by shooting on the 6th day of April.

Both these cases will probably be disposed of at this present term of court. The trial of Lorenzo Caruso, charged with murder in the first degree in killing Raffaele Del Greco in a Hill street saloon last January, will also take place at the present term of the court. The case originally came to the April term, but upon application of Caruso's counsel, Attorneys Russo and Elydenburgh, was continued to the July term.

ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS AT YALE

Young Men Trying Examinations All Over the Country for Entrance—An Estimated Freshman Class of 340.

Examinations for entrance to Yale in the academic, scientific and medical departments began yesterday morning in New Haven and about forty other places in this country, from Maine to California. The returns from these places, which have already been received, show that Yale is holding her own and that she will have as large an incoming class as usual, if not larger.

The examinations for the academic department were held in Alumni hall, where 122 young men appeared for their "finals" and 89 for their preliminaries. This number is a little less than last year, owing to the increase in the number of places in Connecticut where examinations are held, Stamford and Watertown having been added.

Not so large a class is expected in the scientific school this year as last, because the requirements have been increased. The applicant has to pass more and harder examinations. Many schools in the country are lengthening their scientific course and the lengthening of the scientific course in the Hill-house High school will alone cause a decrease in the number of the incoming class by twenty-five. There were 88 applicants for finals and 68 applicants for preliminaries at Sheffield.

Prof. Tracy Peck is conducting the entrance examinations for Yale at Florence, Italy. Prof. E. P. Morris of the Latin department in Yale college estimated that the class of '99 would be about the same number as the class of '98, that is about 340.
