

FINE STRAWBERRIES.

SPECIMENS GROWN IN THE SALT RIVER VALLEY.

Fruit Equal to the Best Raised Anywhere Photographed as an Aid to Judicious Advertising.

A REPUBLICAN reporter was yesterday shown a photograph taken by Mr. Hartwell at the fruit stand of Dorris Bros., showing in the foreground an exhibit of strawberries grown on the ranch of R. E. Farrington, one mile from Phoenix.

The berries are Sharpless seedlings, and compare very favorably with anything ever seen in the berry line, East or West. The reporter was assured that they are of exceedingly fine flavor, notwithstanding the large size, many of which measure over four inches in circumference.

As a test of size ten berries were selected and measured, the measurement running from four to four and three-quarters of an inch.

They were then weighed and the aggregate weight found to be five and one-half ounces, being an average of over a half ounce to the berry. On further inquiry the reporter was told that there are now about twenty acres of strawberry plants in the valley exclusive of small garden patches.

These facts are significant to the fruit-grower and investor, since it is but a few years since it was said that strawberries could not be produced in this section. What other fruits may yet be made successful by proper experiment?

Another matter suggests itself—that is the efficacy of photography in advertising this valley. The entire Territory needs more advertising in the way of spreading reliable information regarding the productions and resources of this country. There is nothing better than a good, clean-cut photograph for conveying to the observer a correct idea of what he can see when he arrives here to behold the reality. THE REPUBLICAN would suggest the plan of getting up sets of views showing orchards, alfalfa, grain, canals, public buildings, etc., to be placed on exhibition in appropriate places in the East. Sets of unmounted views could also be secured by real estate agents and other individuals to send to their customers and friends.
