FARMERS' ALLIANCE.

Branching Out and Preparing to Establish Large Stock Yards.

KANSAS CITY, October 15.—An intended extension of its business by the Farmers' Alliance of the Southwest, was discovered yesterday, when it was learned that they are about to establish independent stock yards in Kansas City.

Texas, Nebraska and Iowa are back of the scheme. Fifty acres of land adjoining the present stock yards is the site of the new yards. By maintaining their own yards the farmers believe they can save much money in marketing cattle, by doing away with commission men and a great part of other expenses.

Osman Digna is preparing for an attack on Suakin. Arrangements are being made to send reinforcements to the relief.

A police census completed yesterday shows New York City to have a population of 1,710,715, an increase of 197,214 over the Government figures.

Commander Charles L. Huntington, Commandant of the Penobscot Navy Yard, died at Saratoga, N. Y., yesterday. He had been ill several months.

The Grand Duke Nicholas, of Russia, who became insane during the recent army maneuvers at Volhynia, will be conveyed to Crimea to spend the winter.

The Prime Minister of Holland yesterday informed Parliament that a conference had decided that the King is unfit to reign, by reason of his illness.

A. M. McRae, secretary and treasurer of the Security Loan and Savings Company, of St. Catherine, Ont., has disappeared, together with \$25,000 of the society funds.

The New York World announces that, yielding to the advice of his physicians, Mr. Pulitzer has withdrawn from the editorship and that the control of the World has been vested in an executive board of its principal editors.

In a speech in the Chamber yesterday, the Premier of New South Wales, declared that the present strike in Australia has been almost as disastrous to the country as a bombardment would have been. The Government, he said, was determined to be supreme.

General Reuben Davis, 85 years of age, died at Aberdeen, Miss., yesterday. He was a first cousin of Jefferson Davis, a prominent figure in the Mexican war and ranked as the most celebrated criminal lawyer in the South. He served in the thirty-fifth and forty-sixth Congresses.




