NORTHERN ARIZONA.

Idea of a Resident Upon Her Necessities and Capabilities. From the Tucson Citizen.

George E. Brown, Deputy United States Marshal, of Prescott, is in the city stopping at the Cosmopolitan.

Mr. Brown left home last Thursday morning, with snow five inches deep. The stage slip to Phoenix through the deep mud, with melting snow and the rain dripping through the leaky stage coach roof for the distance of 106 miles was not, to say the least, a continual source of delight. Speaking of the North and South railroad, Mr. Brown declares that nothing in Arizona would pay better, nor is more needed by both parts of the Territory to be connected. The vicinity of Prescott is in much need of the agricultural productions of the Salt River Valley, as not nearly enough is raised in Northern Arizona for home consumption, making that region dependent upon California produce, which must be hauled 1200 miles. With a railroad south the grain and fruits now shipped out via Southern Pacific Railroad would be bartered for the timber, building stone, lime, etc., of the north rendering mutual benefit incalculable. While on his way here Mr. Brown saw shipped out in one day from Tempe a carload each of honey, of flour and rolled barley. Just such articles as these are badly needed in the vicinity of Prescott, where they would bring a much better price than the consignors of the shipments will in all probability receive. Sixty miles south of Prescott are three mines, the Crown, Hillside and Congress, which in Colorado would be worth a million and a half dollars; situated as they are, with almost no facilities for ore shipments, they are comparatively of little value, furnishing as they do, work for only 100 men, instead of 500 as they should. As to the financial success of the road, Mr. Brown opines that there is nothing better. A few years ago, when the branch road from Prescott Junction to Prescott was proposed, practical business men declared the scheme folly, stating that Miller's mule wagons could haul enough in one month to supply Prescott for six years. However, the branch was built and has been a splendid proposition, averaging profits of \$50 a day for the year 1889. Something of an idea of the need of better produce facilities may be given in the fact that out of the Prescott postoffice every day an average of \$800 is sent in money orders. In its present condition, Northern Arizona is California's money chest, and with the proposed road not one-tenth of the money it now sends there need be sent, when it is so badly needed at home.


