ABOUT COPPER.

Its Present Disposition—Splendid Outlook for the Metal. From the Tucson Citizen.

Arthur Lazarus, representing the firm of Lewis Lazarus & Sons, metal merchants, of 27 Great St. Helens, London, is in the city, stopping at the Palace.

Mr. Lazarus is in America to learn of copper productions and outlook, and has been visiting the Lake Superior and Montana copper mining regions, having just arrived from the latter.

"What do you consider the outlook for the metal to be?" we asked. "Never better," he replied. "Copper is up, away up, and still on the rise. When I left England it was £59 a ton, and on landing at New York I found it worth \$24 to \$25 a ton. How do I account for the rise in prices? In several ways: All stocks are continually reducing, the reduction during the last fortnight in October being enormous; much more is being consumed than was a year ago; deliveries have been very heavy of late. Yes; I think the Barings' failure has affected the money market and that but for it copper would be still higher."

"How is copper being mostly consumed at present?" "Primarily in three ways. First, wire and electric apparatus. Second, Furnace bottoms; this being a very large and very important part of our trade; Third, The manufacture of sulphate of copper, for the destruction of phylloxera, an insect ravaging the grape vines of Europe, especially Spain. This is a new source of disposition for copper, and already a leading one. The sulphate of copper is a most effective remedy, destroying the pest entirely, and at the same time harming the fruit and vine in no particular, it being perfectly safe to partake of the fruit on which the liquid has been applied. The sulphate of copper consists of 25 per cent copper and the metal cannot be brought back, once it becomes an ingredient of the chemical.

"O no; England receives but very little of the American copper production. It is nearly all used in this country, and mostly for electrical supplies. "No, America, that is North America, produces but a small percentage of the copper output of the world. The sources of supply are in this order: First, South America, second, Cape of Good Hope; third, Japan; North America, Australia and Spain."

Mr. Lazarus leaves today for Clifton to examine the various copper properties there, more especially the Arizona Copper Company's mines and apparatus. Afterwards he will visit Bisbee and possibly Red Rock. He is not purchasing copper, but will probably establish agencies for his firms while here.
