THERE is a healthy competition going on between the gardeners of the Court House and City Hall squares. The City Hall plaza has been, heretofore, somewhat in the lead, but recent action by the Board of Supervisors looking toward further improvement of the Court House block, may bring it up in appearance to a par with its neighbor.

IS the case of the Territory vs. Rood, which came before the District Court at Tucson on Tuesday, defendant's counsel raised the point of an illegal Grand Jury, citing in support of the motion the case of the Territory vs. Gill, in the Second Judicial District.

JUDGE KIBBEY, not receiving any intimation from the District Attorney in reference to the calling of a Territorial Grand Jury, yesterday made an order commanding such a body to be summoned for December 15.

TERRITORIAL TREASURER SMITH yesterday received a letter from the United States Treasurer informing him that the Comptroller of the Treasury had been instructed to remit to Mr. Smith a check for \$15,000, for agricultural instruction at the State University.

THERE were placed on the editor's desk yesterday, some oranges and Tangerines from the orange grove near the Falls of the Arizona Canal, twelve miles north-east of Phoenix, which clearly demonstrate the capabilities of the Salt River Valley as an orange-growing section.
