TRICKS OF MORMONISM.

General Murray, former Governor of Utah and the dashing cavalry commander under Sherman on his March to the Sea, is spending the winter in Washington. He is now a resident of California. This stalwart Kentucky Republican shows but little trace of the many fights he has been through.

General Murray says, however, that polygamy is the smallest objectionable feature of the Mormon Church. The attempt to stamp it out without going to the heart of the matter is like a physician treating a patient for some minor malady when some disease is attacking his vitals.

I asked Governor Murray for the remedy. I asked him if he did not think that the gradual approach of modern civilization would, in the end, do away with Mormonism.
