NO WIRES IN PARIS. America Behind in the Matter of Municipal Engineering.

It should be noted that a question how to dispose of wires—a question that makes so vast and so continually recurring an agitation in all American cities—never comes up at all in Paris.

There are, says a writer in the Century, absolutely no obstructive wires in Paris. The government has purchased the telephone system, and all the wires for these services are placed in the subways of sewers.

The wires of the electric companies are buried under the sidewalks. Armored cables are laid in simple conduits, or even in the bare soil, without the slightest difficulty from any point of view.

In crossing streets it is forbidden to break the paving, and underground connection is made from the manholes of the sewers.

The whole city of Paris will have been laid with a network of electric lighting cables a few months hence, and traffic on the sidewalks and in the streets will have suffered a minimum of obstruction, while no injury whatsoever will have been done to pavements.

All these minor questions of practical municipal engineering that we in our cities are attacking in a fumbling, rude, original way, heedless even of the experience of our nearest neighbors, while densely and contentedly ignorant of the experience of foreign cities, have been thoroughly solved in Europe.

Instead of leading the van, we are from ten to fifteen years behind Europe in all these matters. Even in our own field of electrical methods, as a prominent American electrician assured me in Paris last December, we are now five years behind the continent.

He declared that the difficulties our American corporations still complain about, when asked to bury their telegraph, telephone and lighting wires, were all met and vanquished in Europe several years ago, and that our fellow countrymen insist upon remaining in a state of invincible ignorance rather than learn anything from the technical and scientific achievements of Europe.

But perhaps he stated the case too strongly. Doubtless he shall in time learn to be ashamed when we come to a realizing sense of the fact that the one city of France has at its command a larger and more brilliant array of engineering and architectural talent than all the important cities of the United States taken together can show, and that many a small European town is better supplied in this respect than many a large American city.

A RACE PHENOMENON. West India Black Men Beginning to Oppress the Whites.

It is a fact that all over the British West Indies, with the possible exception of Barbadoes, and especially in two of the most valuable and important islands, a steady and determined, though unobtrusive, effort is making by certain ambitious black and colored men in office, in journalism, and in the professions, gradually to oust the whites from commercial enterprise and public life, as a preliminary to making existence generally impossible.

The home government is over and over again induced to make and confirm appointments of men who, while apparently working in amity with their respective administrations and with the white people they hate, are really doing all in their power to subvert the white supremacy, chiefly by pushing black and colored men (whose only qualifications are reading, writing and unbounded impudence) into subordinate positions, where they may hope to leave the official lump.

When ladies are pushed aside in the streets by black loafers; when the black servant who steals from you almost under your very eyes defies you to prosecute him; when officials of the highest character are libeled in public prints by men beneath the intellectual level of an English street boy and that in terms which, through unscrupulous intermediaries, may actually pass to the colonial office or even to the house of commons as the utterance of white men of position—the time has come to speak out plainly.

No wonder that year by year the hopes of West Indian whites turn more and more toward the United States, not one of which is silly enough to allow the negro a dangerous amount of commercial or political power. So much for the disease. And what is the remedy? asks the National Observer. Simply that the colonial office look to it that it knows in whom it trusts. Properly supported by the colonial office, a compact and well organized party of loyal English creoles and other whites in the West Indies might hope for per-
