SCHOOL MATTERS.

The Territorial Board of Examiners Filled
By the Appointment Yesterday of Mrs. A. B. Mitchell of Prescott.

Mrs. Angelina B. Mitchell, of Prescott, has been appointed by Superintendent of Public Instruction Nether-ton as a member of the territorial board of examiners. Mrs. Mitchell is a lady well qualified for the position, as she has a great deal of experience in school work. She at one time held a professorship in the Mt. Holyoke, Mass., Seminary, the oldest female college in that state. Since then she has been identified with educational work in Washington, D. C., in Kansas and New Jersey. The superintendent congratulates himself in having called to his assistance such efficient and worthy aids to the position of a board of examiners as he has.

The board now consists of F. J. Nether-ton, president; A. H. Fulton, of Tempe, secretary, and Mrs. Mitchell, of Prescott, member.

The next quarterly teachers' examination will take place next Monday and Tuesday, September 4-5.

The territorial normal school board met yesterday, August 28, at the Normal school building at Tempe. Mr. Daniel Kloss, president of the board; A. J. Halbert, secretary, and Superintendent of Public Instruction Nether-ton, were present. They straightened out the business of the school up to date, preparatory to the commencement of the new term, which will be next Monday, September 4.

Through the courtesy of the superintendent of public instruction, the following figures concerning the district schools of the territory were given, which will be of interest to all interested in educational work in the territory:

There are 211 school districts in the territory; 292 teachers, and 15,397 census children attending school, which is an increase over last year of 787. For school purposes there has been expended the last year in the territory the sum of \$206,845.60.
