ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE GOLD COIN MINING COMPANY.

Know all men by these presents: That we, C. S. Hoover, W. W. Barnett, Thos. Barnum and C. W. Barnett, residents of Maricopa county, Arizona, desiring to form a corporation under the laws of the territory of Arizona, do hereby adopt, sign and acknowledged, as prescribed by law, these articles of incorporation:

Article 1. The names of the incorporators of this corporation are C. S. Hoover, W. W. Barnett, Thos. Barnum and C. W. Barnett.

Article 2. The name assumed by this corporation and which it shall be known in all its business transactions is Gold Coin Mining Company, and the principal place of transacting its business is and shall be in the city of Phoenix, county of Maricopa, territory of Arizona, and it may also have offices for the transaction of its business at such other place or places as its board of directors may hereafter from time to time by resolution designate and determine, and said corporation may transact any business at any office within the territory so designated with the same force and effect as though transacted at its regular office in Phoenix.

The time of commencement of this corporation shall be on the date of the filing of these articles in the office of the county recorder of Maricopa county, Arizona, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years from that date.

Article 3. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by this corporation is that of dealing in mines and mining property in the territory of Arizona, including the owning of mines and mining property and the leasing and working of the same, also the development and sale of mines and all kinds of machinery, necessary or useful for operating and developing mines and mining property.

Article 4. The amount of the capital stock authorized and the time and conditions upon which it is to be paid in are as follows: The amount of capital stock of this corporation shall be five hundred thousand (\$500,000) dollars, divided into five hundred thousand shares of the par value of one (\$1.00) dollar per share, and the same shall be issued when paid for in money, services or property as the board of directors may determine, and when issued said stock shall be fully paid and shall be non-assessable thereafter.

Article 5. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation is at any time to subject itself or be subjected is the sum of \$50,000.

Article 6. The private property of the stockholders of this corporation shall at all times be exempt from the debts of the corporation.

Article 7. The affairs of the corporation shall be conducted by a board of directors composed of not less than three nor more than five persons, who shall be elected at the annual meeting of the stockholders of this corporation from among their number; its annual meeting shall be held in the city of Phoenix, Arizona, on the second Tuesday in January of each year hereafter at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, and the board of directors so elected shall hold their offices for the term of one year, or until their successors are elected and qualified. The officers of the corporation shall be a president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer, who shall be elected from among the stockholders at the meeting thereof to be held each year, immediately after the annual meeting of the stockholders.

Article 8. All vacancies that may occur in the board of directors or officers shall be filled until the next annual election by the members of the board of directors containing the number of directors remaining to be filled. Any person who shall cease to be a stockholder of this corporation shall cease to be an officer and director therein. The board of directors may appoint such agent or agents as it may deem necessary or expedient for the transaction of its business; and the board of directors shall also fix the compensation of its officers, directors and agents employed in its business.

Article 9. These articles of incorporation may be amended at any annual meeting of the stockholders or any special meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose by a two-thirds vote of the stock represented at such meeting, either in person or by proxy, in favor of such amendment. Whenever any amendment of these articles of incorporation shall be adopted in the manner herein specified, the same shall be acknowledged by the president of

the corporation, and when filed in the office of the county recorder of Maricopa county, Arizona, and published according to law, shall have the same force and effect as though signed by all the stockholders in said corporation.
