Balfour Was Right in His Statement to the House of Commons.

The Hague, Jan. 29.—In the first chamber of the states general today the premier, Dr. Kuyper, replying to a question on the subject, confirmed the accuracy of A. J. Balfour's statement in the British house of commons yesterday regarding the Dutch government's offer to help in bringing about peace in South Africa, but the premier added that he was prevented by courtesy from disclosing any details concerning the note so long as the British government has not published its contents or until a reply to it is received.

CARNEGIE COLLEGE BEGINS TO TAKE SHAPE

The Work of Organization and Deed of Gift Presented.

Washington, Jan. 29.—An adjourned meeting of the trustees of the Carnegie institute was held at the state department this afternoon and a long step was taken toward permanent organization and initiation of the work of the institution. Abraham S. Hewitt of New York called the meeting to order and Secretary Hay was elected temporary chairman and Charles D. Daleott temporary secretary.

W. E. Dodge of New York was elected to the board to fill the vacancy caused by the declination of ex-President Cleveland, who sent a letter regretting his inability to serve. After the roll call Andrew Carnegie made a brief address, presenting the deed of gift. After accepting the deed of gift the trustees proceeded to adopt by-laws and then elected the following officers: Chairman of the board of trustees, Abraham S. Hewitt; vice chairman, Dr. J. H. Billings; secretary, Charles D. Daleott; Dr. J. C. Gilman, late of Johns Hopkins university, was elected president of the Carnegie institution. The board then adjourned to meet tomorrow.

AN INDIANA FIRE.

Wolcott, Ind., Jan. 29.—Fire originating in Odd Fellows' hall, over Spencer Bros' drug store, wiped out nearly the entire business section of the city, entailing a property loss of more than \$120,000.

SNOW AT CINCINNATI.

Cincinnati, O., Jan. 29.—A heavy snow and sleet storm struck this city early this morning and tonight over four inches of snow covers the ground. Street cars have much difficulty in running and some trains from the west are reported delayed. The storm is general over the Ohio valley.

NOT A CHALLENGER.

Louisville, Ky., Jan. 29.—Young Corbett tonight asked the Associated Press to deny the report that he agreed to fight at Louisville the winner of the Sullivan McGovern contest, which will take place here February 22. Corbett says his manager is not with him, and so far as he knows he will not fight again until next fall.
