## THE COWAN BILL

(Continued from Page One.)

Bills providing for the exhibit at the Oregon fair of 1905, and for a reduction of the fees for acknowledgments and depositions, passed. A public printer bill (house bill No. 178) went through the house after some debate, and Cowan's bill relating to insurance corporations was favorably disposed of. The house also passed a council bill limiting the hours of railroad men to sixteen hours' work for one day.

By indefinite postponement the house killed house bills Nos. 168, 188, 80 and 117, and Woolf's bill fixing banks of canals, and a bill providing for the employment of jailers and guards by the sheriff.

In the lower house in the morning session the committee reported unfavorably on a bill prohibiting gambling and the sale of liquor on the same floor. A bill amending the revised statutes and providing that railroads shall not charge more than 20 per cent more per mile per ton for short hauls than for long hauls was passed by a vote of 13 to 5.

House bill No. 45, providing payment of salaries of county officers, was killed in the council yesterday morning. House bill No. 6, relating to trust companies, was passed. Upon motion of Judge Kibbey the committee on claims was released from further consideration of a house bill which provides for the relief of Mrs. Oceano Tafolla, widow of a ranger.


