Another notable real estate deal was consummated yesterday when Eugene Jackson sold the Buckeye Ranch to E. E. Jack.

Mr. Charles E. Coon, who is at Cananea with Joe Fifield, Phil Sheridan, Geo. Grosvenor and other expatriated citizens of Phoenix, is in town again and will remain here for a few days. He said that just before he left Cananea Shirley Christy and O. H. Shuster arrived there in their automobile which is of the "Red Devil" variety and one of the swiftest and most expensive in the southwest. The natives at Cananea had never seen anything like it and Mr. Fifield warned the proprietors that they had better stay within the American part of town. They neglected the warning and engaged in splitting the atmosphere in the old town. The inhabitants were panic-stricken. Many who had not been in the habit of praying were overcome by a religious sentiment and knelt down in the street praying to the saints for protection against the red scourge. Many of them put themselves in imminent danger of being run over by the juggernaut.

A team of horses frightened by the strange creature ran away and one of the animals was killed. By this time the gendarmes fiscal and all the other officers sworn to the protection of that part of Mexico gathered and Messrs. Christy and Shuster were stopped in their head long career. It is the custom in Mexico to hold somebody responsible for every accident that occurs. It is also the custom to arrest not only the alleged perpetrators but all their immediate belongings. That was done in this case, but the Mexicans did not know what to do with the automobile. They could for a long time think of no way to get it to jail. At length a six mule team was unseamed and the "Red Devil" was loaded on a big wagon and taken to the place of incarceration. It is said to be the greatest humiliation ever put on one of those aristocratic machines.

Mr. Coon said that after he left Cananea he learned that the matter had been adjusted somehow and Messrs. Christy and Shuster were no longer incommunicado.

Articles of Incorporation of THE CATHOLIC BANKING COMPANY OF MEXICO.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, whose names are hereunto affixed, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purposes of organizing a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and to that end make the following constitution:

1. The names of the incorporators are Andrew D. Barlow, Trinidad Sanchez Santos, and L. B. Spyer.

2. The name of the corporation shall be "The Catholic Banking Company of Mexico."

3. The principal place in which the business of said corporation within the Territory of Arizona shall be conducted is Phoenix, Maricopa County, Arizona, and the principal place of business of said corporation outside the Territory of Arizona shall be the City of Mexico, in the Republic of Mexico, at which meetings of the board of directors and stockholders may be held, and the corporation may have such branch offices and conduct its business in any of the states, territories or dependencies of the United States or in any place, city or state in the Republic of Mexico or in any foreign country.

4. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by this corporation is as follows, to-wit: to do a general banking, loan and trust business, transacted in its name, in that of other parties or with a joint interest; to make contracts to purchase, lease, hold, locate or otherwise acquire, own, exchange,

sell or otherwise dispose of, pledge, mortgage, hypothecate and deal in real estate and any and all kinds of personal property, mines, mining claims, oil lands, mineral lands, oil gas, asphaltum, petroleum, asbestos, salt, water and water rights and machinery, and to work, mine, explore, operate and develop the same, to do a general real estate, manufacturing and mercantile business; to own, handle and control letters patent and other corporations; to borrow money and issue notes, bonds, mortgages, promissory notes and other securities and obligations any and all rights, powers and privileges of individual citizens thereof, and to exercise the right to vote upon any shares of stock held by it to the same extent that a natural person might or could do in general to do all things necessary to the proper conduct of its business in the United States of America, the Republic of Mexico and elsewhere.

The special nature of the business to be transacted is as follows:

(a) To issue, discount, purchase, sell and negotiate letters of exchange, drafts, checks and orders of all kinds payable in the Republic of Mexico or in foreign countries.

(b) To purchase and sell precious metals and to make advances on shipments of the same which are made through the company, for their sale in Mexico or abroad.

(c) To make advances on bills of lading covering merchandise or national products which are shipped from one place to another in any of the foreign countries, also upon notes and values of all descriptions.

(d) To discount promissory notes and all kinds of documents and titles of credits payable in the Republic of Mexico, provided the date when they become due does not exceed six months and that they are accepted by the board of directors.

(e) To keep a current list of the names of the clients of the company, with or without their addresses.

(f) To receive deposits on current accounts, and to issue checks thereon.

(g) To make loans and discounts with collateral security upon all kinds of real and commercial effects, which may be approved by the board of directors.

(h) To open current accounts subject to interest, with persons of well-known good standing, with a stipulation that such accounts must be for a fixed amount to be settled within a term not to exceed six months, and with the condition that the debtor must sign the document which the board of directors may decide.

(i) To act as attorney-in-fact and representative of private parties, companies, mining corporations, agricultural and commercial institutions and companies of other characters.

(j) To act as trustees of real estate, personal property and all kinds of business institutions.

(k) To perform as agents in the name of private parties, companies, societies and commercial institutions which can be immediately disposed of and are of all kinds of nature, the sale and purchase of houses, farms, haciendas, properties and values of all kinds; to loan money on no other security.

(l) To act as administrators of estate of deceased persons.

(m) To receive as a voluntary deposit all kinds of shares, bonds, titles, deeds, titles and precious metals or objects.

(n) To give its guarantee to facilitate the discount or sale of commercial effects which become due within a maximum term of six months.

(o) To invest in capital and its deposits the purchase of real estate, foreign coins and precious metals, and all kinds of public and private securities, bonds and those issued by the states and cities of Mexico, bonds issued by the municipalities of Mexico, and commercial institutions which can be immediately disposed of and are of all kinds of nature, the sale and purchase of houses, farms, haciendas, properties and values of all kinds; to loan money on no other security.

(p) To perform the service of paying interest payable in the Republic of Mexico or abroad accruing on bonds which may have been issued by governments, states, municipalities, agricultural and industrial, mining, agricultural and commercial corporations.

(q) To make in the name of private parties, societies or public establishments and institutions, moneys due on all kinds of documents and to keep in its vaults the values that may be delivered to it, thus performing the service of a safe deposit bank in behalf of the private parties, societies or public establishments and institutions, and doing a general trust business.

(r) To take charge of the investment and collection of public subscriptions.

(s) To make in the name of private parties, societies or public establishments in the Republic of Mexico, as well as abroad, relating to the sale and redemption of shares and bonds issued by governments and private parties or on its own account.

(t) To issue bonds, mortgages and all kinds of securities to insure the observance of responsibilities and obligations contracted in favor of the company, and in general to transact in its own name, in the name of others with a joint interest, all kinds of banking operations, or mercantile transactions, provided the term of all the above-mentioned operations as made with banks, merchants, manufacturers, proprietors and agriculturalists, does not exceed six months.

5. The authorized amount of capital stock of this corporation shall be six million Mexican dollars, divided into 60,000 shares of the par value of one hundred dollars, Mexican money, each share to be paid in full by the subscribers, and the balance of the par value of said stock may be paid in cash or by the sale and transfer to it of real or personal property for the use and benefit of the corporation, in payment for which shares of the capital stock of said corporation may be issued, and the capital stock of the corporation thereupon and thereby become and be fully paid up and non-assessable, and in the absence of actual notice of the dissolution of the corporation the directors shall be conclusively deemed to have authorized the board of directors to issue additional nine thousand (9,000) founder's shares, which shall be issued to and owned by the founders, their successors or assigns.

6. The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date of the filing of these articles of incorporation in the office of the secretary of Arizona, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years thereafter. This period may be renewed in further periods of twenty-five years, provided in compliance with the provisions of law.

7. The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a board of eight (8) directors, and a substitute for each director in case of necessity, which will direct this company according to the provisions of the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and the board of directors shall consist of eight of the shareholders who are founders and eight others. They will exercise all the functions with all the facilities conceded by the laws until the general meeting in 1904 elects a new board or re-elects the old one. The board of directors elected at the general meeting shall be subject to the provisions and conditions of the by-laws.

8. The highest amount indebtedness of this corporation is at any time subject shall be two-thirds (2/3) of the amount of the capital stock, but as provided by Section 56, Chapter 5, Revised Statutes of Arizona for 1901, the amount of indebtedness shall not include receiving deposits, issuing certificates of deposit or other obligations of the corporation, or the proceeds of the banking, trust and loan business.

9. This corporation shall have and it hereby reserves the right to alter, amend or change any or all of the provisions of the articles of incorporation, and to increase or diminish its capital stock, in such manner as is now or may hereafter be provided by the laws of the Territory of Arizona or the by-laws of this corporation.

10. The officers of this corporation shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary, cashier, accountant, examining auditor and two substitutes, and such other officers as the board of directors may deem necessary, who shall be chosen by such board, except the examining auditor and his substitutes, who shall be chosen by the shareholders. These officers are subject to the provisions of the by-laws.

11. The books of the corporation may be kept in the City of Mexico.

12. The private property of the stockholders of this corporation shall be exempt from corporate debts of any kind whatsoever.
