


**WRIT DENIED**—The Tucson Citizen says that Judge Campbell denied the habeas corpus petition in behalf of Wiley, the man who was arrested for running a gambling game within a mile of the city limits of Tucson. That has the effect so far of validating the ordinance Wiley violated. His attorneys will now make a similar application to the supreme court.

**A NEW KIND OF RUST**—Bishop Jones of Lehi was in the city yesterday. Speaking of crops in his part of the county he said that the rust of which there is such widespread complaint has almost totally destroyed the wheat. He said that the rust is different from any he ever saw before. Instead of being red it is black and instead of existing in only swampy places it spreads all over the country so that probably it is no rust at all but some other kind of agricultural scourge.

**CHANGED THEIR COURSE**—It is pleasing news for all of the great arid west to learn that the itinerary of the congressional irrigation party that recently visited Phoenix, was changed after the party reached San Francisco. It was the intention to go from there to the Truckee project direct in which event much of the finest part of irrigated California would have been overlooked, instead of looked over. The members of the party expressed a desire to see the famous San Joaquin valley and other places so a special side trip was arranged enabling them to visit Fresno, Modesto, Stockton, the Sacramento valley, Woodland, Red Bluffs, Redding, Chico, Biggs, Oroville, Marysville and a dozen other important places.

It is her present intention to return again in the fall. 
