The determination of the people of Oklahoma to go it alone with the Indian Territory in statehood legislation hereafter has the hearty approval of Arizona.

There was a time when such action on the part of Oklahoma would have been disappointing to Arizona; that was when the omnibus bill, providing for the admission of Oklahoma, New Mexico and Arizona as three states was pending.

In the last congress the Hamilton bill was strongly supported by Oklahoma and the Indian Territory and by their friends in congress, and that support lent great strength to the measure in both houses.

Over and above the assets held for and the payments made to policy-holders is the sum of \$317,000,000, which represents the net profit on the insurance investments and properly
