THE ROAD TO GOLDFIELD.—The board of supervisors, yesterday, ordered advertisement for contracts for the grading of the road between Mesa and Goldfield.

A SUIT FOR DIVORCE.—Suit was heard in district court yesterday by Anna J. Whitcomb against Charles B. Whitcomb for divorce on the ground of desertion. The parties were married in Austin, Tex., in 1932. The abandonment occurred less than two years later. The defendant's place of residence is unknown.

A MONSTER CAR.—An unusual incident in shipping circles in Phoenix yesterday, was the arrival of a fifty-foot freight car, the contents of which were consigned to the Dorris-Heyman Furniture company. This is the first time that such a monster merchandise car ever passed over a railroad entering Phoenix. The size of it may be gathered by comparing it with the ordinary thirty-foot freight car.

NEW CORPORATIONS.—Articles of the following corporations were filed in the office of the county recorder yesterday as follows: Donorco-Zunkel Confectionery company, capital stock, \$20,000, incorporators, D. A. Donorfio, Clara Zunkel and Corilyn Zunkel; Donorfio Crystallized Cactus Candy company, capital stock, \$50,000; incorporators, D. A. Donorfio and Harry Lee Dunton; Golden Key Mining company, capital stock, \$1,000,000, incorporators, J. U. and J. B. Baushelle and G. T. Vickers. The articles of the Buckeye Mining and Smelting company were amended by fixing the capital stock at \$1,500,000.

COL. DRAVO'S TAXES.—All the older residents of the valley remember Col. Dravo, the Lieutenant Dravo stationed at Fort McDowell when General, then Colonel Adna R. Chaffee was in command. He left here shortly before the abandonment of the post, but having invested in mining property and real estate here, he has frequently visited Phoenix since, though he has not been here for the last six years. Yesterday Lincoln Fowler visited the county treasurer's office to pay Col. Dravo's taxes. He brought with him a letter containing the draft. The collector did not know the precise amount of the taxes, so he sent enough and wrote: "Whatever is left over keep for the taxes next year." Then he added: "On mature consideration, whatever is left you may spend for beer." Col. Dravo for some time has been connected with the commissary department at Governor's Island. He wrote that he would leave in ten days for the Philippines.

C. T. U. of Arizona, 1935."
