IT'S NATIONAL BUSINESS REBUILDING OF FRISCO

This View of the Matter Presented to the President.

San Francisco, June 9.—A telegram was sent to President Roosevelt today setting forth the conditions existing in San Francisco and offering suggestions by which aid may be given by the national government through action by congress. It is pointed out that the disaster which has fallen upon the city is not purely local, as it involves a great national port closely related to interstate and foreign commerce, the regulation of which as well as all measures affecting the general welfare is entrusted by the constitution to congress. Therefore, it is asked that the precedents established in the cases of the Pacific railroads, Cuba national expositions, and other instances be followed.

It is suggested that congress authorize first a loan to the National Red Cross of \$10,000,000 to aid in the reconstruction of the homeless in houses before next winter; second, that the secretary of the treasury be authorized to accept \$12,000,000 of bonds now unsold in the city treasury as security for the deposit of national moneys with the banks, and, third, that such other measures be adopted as may be deemed appropriate.

The president is informed that a commission has been appointed to confer with him and the secretary of the treasury on the subject with a view of expediting action. The telegram is signed by Governor Pardee, Mayor Schmidt and William F. Herrin, acting chairman of the Citizens' finance committee.

Messages were also sent by Secretary R. P. Jennings of the reconstruction committee to Secretary Shaw, Senator Perkins and Congressman Hayes, calling their attention and that of the entire California delegation to the matter and asking their earnest co-operation.

FEMALE BLUEBEARD.

The Opening of the Trial of Mrs. Le Doux.

Stockton, Cal., June 9.—District Attorney Norton this morning made the opening statement of what the prosecution expects to prove in the case of Mrs. Emma Le Doux, charged with the murder by poison in this city on March 24 of her alleged husband, A. N. McVicar. Mr. Norton said it would be shown that she married McVicar in Bisbee, Ariz., September 1, 1902; three years later she married Eugene Le Doux, without having secured a divorce from McVicar. The alleged motive was her strong love for Le Doux. McVicar's body was found in a trunk in the baggage room of the local station, where it was sent for shipment as baggage.

PARLIAMENT TALKS THE EMPEROR DRIFTS

The Uncertain Progress of the Reformation of Russia.

St. Petersburg, June 9.—The report of the retirement of the Goremynkin ministry was definitely denied late today when the premier returned to St. Petersburg from Peterhof where he went this afternoon for an audience with the emperor and authorized the statement that he had not tendered his resignation and had no present expectation of retiring. Since the parliament's passage of the resolution of a lack of confidence, when the emperor declined to avail himself of Premier Goremynkin's offer to resign and expressed accord with the policy outlined in his amendments offered to parliament, his majesty has given no intimation of a desire for his resignation.

No immediate developments are expected. The avoidance thus far of an open rupture and the prospective maintenance of the status quo for a month to come, while parliament is indulging in oratory instead of action on the agrarian problem has apparently inspired the emperor's present determination to retain M. Goremynkin and continue the policy of drift.

Another motive, probably was the difficulty of finding an available man to replace Goremynkin. The bureaucracy would be no more acceptable to parliament. M. Shipoff and Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky, who are qualified to mediate between the throne and parliament declined the post in advance. The first named because he believed the attempt would be fruitless and the latter on account of ill health. The Emperor Nicholas is not ready to take the plunge with a ministry chosen from parliament.

ENGLAND FOR \$125.

There is only one inimitable vacation—a trip to England, through England and home again, says Country Life in America. Nine weeks of travel can be had for \$125, and this easy price includes the full expenses of both ocean voyages. Bicycle clothes and flannel shirts make up one proper costume. The ordinary sack suit, with long trousers is equally serviceable. The luggage for walking will be carried in a cloth-covered India rubber knapsack. This is light, portable and rainproof. If the traveler makes his way by bicycle, he should nearly limit his luggage to the dimensions of a diamond frame case. The slight overflow will be made into a thin bundle strapped to the handle bars, or to the frame behind the saddle. A "stripped" wheel is essential, guard and bell and brake being of the lightest. The ocean trip is made in the second cabin of one of the lines plying between New York and Glasgow—the cost is \$30 single, and \$60 for the round trip. The food is not poor, and there is abundance of deck room. The time from dock to dock is ten and one-half days, so the total time on water is twenty-one days, and on land six weeks.




