POSSIBLY INSANE.

A Man Who Threatened J. H. Cummings With an Ax Yesterday.

Work on the Goodwin building came to a momentary stop yesterday shortly before noon. A stranger appeared on the scene and offered for sale among the workmen a tool marking device. His method of offering his wares was so objectionable that Mr. Cummings remonstrated with him and suggested that he use a little milder language. Thereupon, the stranger grabbed a near-by ax and threatened the life of the contractor. Peace was secured, however, without further demonstration and the stranger went on down the street. Shortly after, Mr. Cummings swore out a complaint against him, charging him with assault and battery and he was placed in jail by Deputy Eosterwood. At 5 o'clock he was brought before Justice Nielsen for a hearing and gave his name as C. H. Hardy. He pleaded not guilty and insisted that he be given a jury trial. The demand was granted and the case will come up this morning at 9 o'clock.
