THE LOWERING OF THE UPPER BERTH.

The state supreme court of Wisconsin has declared unconstitutional the Nye law prohibiting Pullman car companies from lowering the unoccupied upper berth of a sleeping car upon a protesting occupant of the lower berth.

Mr. Nye arrived at Madison one morning in increased temperature in consequence of a controversy with a Pullman porter about the matter of lowering the upper berth.

It may seem unnecessary cruelty on the part of the company to coop up a patron in a lower berth when the upper is not in use, yet at the time of securing his berth, the passenger has no reason to believe that he will be allowed the use and privileges of a section for the price of a double berth.


