## AN ASSAULT MADE ON ALDERMAN TILTE

HEATED INCIDENT OF THE COUNCIL SESSION.

A Charge Disproved That Mr. Lukin Was Not a Property Owner.

The city fathers met in regular monthly session Thursday evening to look after the interest of our town. After the regular routine of business such as ordering the payment of bills, etc., they took up new business and had rather a warm meeting. An order was made to place a license on cigar stands, refreshment stands and all other lines of business which came under the present charter.

The superintendent of the water company was ordered to lay 400 feet of two-inch pipe on East 3rd street. By request of the chief of the fire department, it was decided to purchase two reducers to connect the water pipes and the hose, provided the Mesa fire department would purchase two expanders. This agreement has been made in order that, in case of an extensive fire in either town, the one can assist the other.

The meeting was about to adjourn in peace when Councilman Stetzelreide arose and made the statement that one of the councilmen was not entitled to a seat in that body because he did not hold in his own name, real estate in the town at the time of his election. The discussion grew very warm when Mr. Stetzelreide informed them that Mr. Lukin was the member to whom he referred. A heated discussion followed with charges, counter-charges and recrimination. Finally the charges brought against Mr. Lukin were referred to the city attorney for investigation.

This morning Mr. Lukin produced the necessary papers to convince his opponent that he was a property owner at the time of his election. Mr. Lukin says: "It is a conspiracy on the part of Mr. Stetzelreide, Mr. Fogal and the attorneys for the new telephone company to displace me with a man who is in favor of granting a city franchise to their company."

ADVERTISEMENT OF PLANS FOR BRIDGE. Pursuant to an act passed by the last legislative assembly, entitled "An act relating to the construction of bridges across non-navigable streams in the Territory of Arizona," whereby the county of Maricopa is authorized to construct a bridge across Salt river, and pursuant to paragraph 2566 of the revised statutes of Arizona, 1901, the board of supervisors of Maricopa county do hereby advertise for and invite plans and specifications in detail for the construction of a bridge across Salt river beginning at a point at the north bank of said Salt river, due south as may be practicable of Center street in the city of Phoenix, Maricopa county, Arizona, said point being in the south half of section seventeen, T. 1 N. R. 2 E. of the G. & S. R. B. & M. line, county of Maricopa, territory of Arizona; said bridge to extend south across the said Salt river and to be, together with the causeway on the south end and the rip-rap and protection of the bank on the north side of the river, about three thousand feet in length and to terminate on the south side of said river at a point on the north half of section twenty, T. 1 N. R. 2 E. G. S. R. B. & M. line, county of Maricopa, territory of Arizona.

the county of Maricopa is to pay and be responsible for, the balance of which said sum of (\$25,000.00) being raised by subscription and bonus. The amount of premium to be awarded to the architect whose plans and specifications may be adopted shall be 5 per cent of the cost of the construction of the bridge; 2 1/2 per cent to be paid on the adoption of the plans and specifications, the balance of 2 1/2 per cent to be paid on the completion of said bridge and the acceptance thereof.

Said premium to be in payment in full for the services of said architect in drawing said plans and specifications and in supervising the construction of said bridge and during the construction of said bridge the same shall be subject to constant and personal supervision by the architect whose plans are adopted or by his or its representative. Said premium shall not, however, be paid by the board of supervisors until the architect's plans are accepted unless after due advertising some responsible contractor shall contract to construct said bridge according to said plans and specifications at a cost not exceeding (\$100,000.00) including the price of premium paid to architect and the construction of said bridge and during the construction of said bridge the same shall be subject to constant and personal supervision by the architect whose plans are adopted or by his or its representative.

All plans and specifications must be received and filed in the office of the board on or before 2 o'clock p.m., Tuesday, Sept. 7, 1909. The right to reject any and all plans is expressly reserved by the board of supervisors of Maricopa county, Arizona territory.
