OF LOCAL INTEREST

A NEW NOTARY.—A notarial commission was issued yesterday to C. Hesse, Jr., of Holbrook.

CUMMINS-ESTES.—George W. Cummins and Miss Nancy Bourbon Estes were united in marriage yesterday by Rev. R. C. Douglass of the Central Methodist church. The groom has been a resident of the valley for some time. The bride is a recent arrival from Cumberland, Tenn.

QUIT OF DANGER.—Another letter was received yesterday from Chairman Hoghe of the board of supervisors, who has been at the Pasteur Institute at Chicago for the last two weeks. Mr. Hoghe writes that he has been assured that he no longer stands in danger of rabies, as a result of an encounter with a skunk, and that he will be at home by November 1.

DISTRICT COURT.—Yesterday's session of district court was largely given over to divorce matters. Rita M. Long was freed of the bonds which had united her to William Long. Margarita Villanueva was granted a separation from Guadalupe Villanueva, and Josefa Rivera was divorced from Alfonso Rivera. In all cases abandonment was charged. None of the erring husbands offered any sort of a defense. In the case of Tomacita Lewis, charged with murder and whose case was before the last grand jury, by which it was referred to the coming one, was surrendered by her bondsmen and was released on her personal recognizance. The three cases of Leon Bouvier against W. W. Willis were dismissed on the motion of the plaintiff.

RESTAURANT TO BE ENLARGED.—The American Kitchen will soon be enlarged to take in the rear of the Hoffman saloon. Tom, the proprietor, asked permission yesterday of Marshal Moore to remove the partition between the saloon and the restaurant. His petition was granted when he explained that there would be no direct connection between the Kitchen and the saloon.

"DR. STAR'S" CASE.—The case of Francisco Estrella, who calls himself Dr. Star, came before Justice Johnson yesterday afternoon. Estrella was arraigned on the charge of practicing medicine with a license, and he says that there was nothing in it, and that he can prove it. A cloud of witnesses has been summoned to testify to the fact of the doctor's ministrations, but it is said that none of them would offer testimony as to the efficiency of his ministrations. According to the word of some of the witnesses, he was a good doctor in some respects. He was a most inexorable collector of his bills. His patients were of a class which does not have a great deal of money at any time, but they were so constantly dunned for money that they paid it as fast as they got it. His practice came nearer being a paid up practice than that of any other physician in town.

A. J. DORAN IN TOWN.—A. J. Doran of Prescott, who is to be superintendent of the new Arizona Pioneers' Home at that city, came to Phoenix yesterday on a short business visit. He said that work will begin in a month or so on the building. The home was created by the last legislature, which appropriated \$15,000 for the purpose. The site has been selected but the work of construction cannot begin until the money raised by taxation is available.

A MISUNDERSTANDING.—The Associated Press correspondent at Yuma was evidently mistaken in stating that F. H. Newell and Arthur P. Davis, direct and chief engineer, respectively, of the reclamation service, were in Yuma Monday. It was learned yesterday that they were not there to meet Secretary Balingier as stated. Mr. Newell is believed to be in Washington at this time, though Mr. Davis is somewhere in the west and may visit Arizona soon.

REMOVING A LANDMARK.—The old adobe building opposite the post-office that has served the sentimental purpose of making the Central school building look bigger and better than it is by comparison since a long time before a lot of lively young business men of this city were born, has finally given way to the march of progress. It is to be torn down and the debris is being hauled away, preparatory to the erection of a brick business building by Dr. W. Craig, the present owner of the lot.

THALHEIMERS RETURN.—Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Thalheimer and Miss Emma Thalheimer returned yesterday from their trip abroad. Nearly all of the time was passed in Germany, where they have many relatives. They left Phoenix early in the spring and have been traveling ever since. Their tour included most of the larger cities of the German empire. During their stay abroad Miss Thalheimer wrote several exceedingly interesting letters to this paper which were published at the time. One of them described the flights of Zeppelin at Nuremberg. They arrived in that quaint old city at about the same time that Zeppelin flew over it. Miss Thalheimer also sent a very interesting description letter to German art. They are of course very glad to get back to Arizona and the recollections of the trip will last them a long time before going again.
