THE FIRST BATTALION'S FIRST RIFLE MATCH

Description of the Shoot on Washington's Birthday.

There is an exhibition in the windows of the Hilderbran company the cup for which the First Battalion shoot will be held on Washington's birthday. The cup is a beautiful and massive silver receptacle, plated on the inner side with gold.

The cup will be the property for at least one year of the organization whose team wins the match. At the next annual shoot, of which this is to be the first, it must be contested for again.

The shooting grounds will be near the Red Butte east of the Clayton ranch. All who are interested in this form of sport are invited to be present. The shooting will continue throughout the day and the members of the teams and their friends will prepare for an all-day event by taking their lunches with them.

It is expected that on the same day a match will be shot with the team of the Bisbee Rifle club.

That there will be some good shooting is assured by the fact that each organization contains several men who represented the territorial militia

at Camp Perry. Company A has had two representatives; Company B, 2; Company C, 2; Company D, 2, and the staff, 2.

The following is the official description of the match:

Name—This match shall be known as the First Battalion match. Contestants—Teams of six men from Companies A, B, C and D, First Infantry, National Guard of Arizona, and a team of six men composed of the major and staff of the First Battalion, First Infantry, National Guard of Arizona.

Time and Place—This match shall be held annually on the 22d day of February, at the territorial rifle range, about six miles east of Phoenix. Firing will begin at 8:30 a. m.

Distances and Order of Fire—Slow fire; 200, 300 and 500 yards to be fired in the order above-named.

Rules—The rules as provided for the marksman's course, in Special Course 4, in the Small Arms Firing Regulations of the United States Army, shall govern this match.

Coaching will be allowed at all ranges. All persons except the men firing and the coaches will remain five yards in rear of the firing point.

Prize—The prize for this match will be the First Battalion cup, and will be held for one year by the organization whose team wins the match. The major of the battalion is the proper custodian of the cup when won by the staff team; the captain of the company when won by a company team.

Ammunition—Each team shall furnish its own ammunition.

Executive Officer—The executive officer will have control of the range for the conduct of this match, and his decision shall be final.

Pit Men and Scorers—Each company will furnish a detail of two pit men and one scorer.

Amendments—These regulations may be amended at any time by a majority vote of the commanding officers of the contesting organizations.
