SHIRRED EGGS.

For shirred eggs, use individual china dishes, although a dish holding several eggs will do. Butter the dishes, break one egg into each, sprinkle a little salt on the white, but do not on the yolk. Place on shelf in the oven so the heat will be greatest on top. Bake the yolks several times while making as soon as the glaze is formed, remove from the oven and if not sufficiently cooked place on top of the range for a moment. Care must be used to keep the eggs from becoming dry. Serve in the dishes in which they are baked.

STEWED SHIN OF BEEF.

Have the butcher cut the bone into several pieces. Put all the ingredients except flour and butter into a stewpan and bring to a boil. Set the pan where the liquor will just simmer for six hours or, after boiling for five or ten minutes, put into a fireless cooker for nine or ten hours. With the butter, flour and one-half cupful of clear soup, from which the fat has been removed, make a brown sauce and add the meat and the marrow removed from the bone. Heat and serve. The remainder of the liquid may be used for soup.
