ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION. KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned, have this day associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under Chapter II, Title XIII, Revised Statutes of Arizona, 1901, and acts amendatory thereto, and to that end do hereby certify and declare:

ARTICLE I. The name of this Corporation shall be Farmers and Merchants Bank, Phoenix.

ARTICLE II. The principal place of business of this Corporation within the Territory of Arizona, shall be at Phoenix, Maricopa County, and at such other places as the Board of Directors may determine, where meetings of Stockholders and Directors may be held and all business transacted.

ARTICLE III. The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted is as follows, to-wit: To do any and all of the things herein mentioned, as fully and to the same extent as natural persons might or could do the same, and in any part of the world; to transact, promote and carry on a general commercial banking business; and to exercise by its Board of Directors or duly authorized officers and agents, subject to law, all such incidental powers as shall be necessary to carry on said general commercial banking business. In furtherance, but not in limitation of the general powers conferred by the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and the objects and purposes herein set forth, it is expressly provided that said corporation shall also have the following powers:

To receive deposits; to discount and negotiate promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange and other evidences of debt; to buy and sell exchange, coin and bullion, and to collect for others money due them on notes, checks, drafts, bills of exchange, commercial paper or other evidences of indebtedness; to act as escrow agent; to borrow or raise money by the issue of its notes, debentures or other form of obligation, and if necessary or advisable, to secure the payment of the same by the deposit of stock securities or other personal property as collateral for said payment, or by executing mortgages, liens or other form of security on any of the property of said corporation, real, personal or mixed; to loan money and when deemed advisable, to require and receive a mortgage on real property or a deposit and pledge of, or mortgage on personal property or other property security for the payment of the same; to draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, warrants, bonds, debentures and other negotiable or

transferable instruments; to enter into, make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind and for any lawful purpose, with any firm, association or corporation; to purchase or otherwise acquire, and to hold, own and enjoy, and to mortgage, convey or otherwise dispose of property of every kind, character and description, real, personal and mixed, to purchase or otherwise acquire and deal in, and to hold, sell or otherwise dispose of, the shares of this or any other corporation, and to buy, sell, take, own, hold and deal in bonds, mortgages, pledges, choses in action, judgments, inventions, trade-marks, patents, licenses, privileges, options, and property of every kind and character, to install and set up safes, deposit boxes, and in general to do all things necessary to the proper conduct of the business of this Corporation not inconsistent with the laws of the United States and the Territory of Arizona.

ARTICLE IV. The authorized amount of capital stock of this Corporation shall be Twenty-five Thousand and no-100 dollars (\$25,000.00) divided into two hundred and fifty shares of the par value of one hundred and no-100 dollars (\$100.00) each. At such time as the Board of Directors may by resolution direct, said capital stock shall be paid into this Corporation, either in cash or by the sale and transfer to it of real or personal property for the uses and purposes of said Corporation, in payment for which shares of the capital stock of said Corporation may be issued, and the capital stock so issued shall thereupon and thereby become and be fully paid up and non-assessable, and in the absence of actual fraud in the transaction the judgment of the Directors as to the value of the property purchased shall be conclusive.

ARTICLE V. The time of the commencement of this Corporation shall be the date of the filing of a certified copy of these articles of incorporation in the office of the Auditor of Arizona, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years thereafter with privilege of renewal as provided by law.

ARTICLE VI. The affairs of this Corporation shall be conducted by a Board of not less than three nor more than ten Directors, by whom a President and Vice-President shall be elected and a Secretary and Treasurer appointed. The directors shall be elected by and from among the stockholders on the first day of January in each year. Until their successors have been elected and have qualified, the following named persons shall be the Directors and Officers: F. S. Westfall, J. B. Westfall, W. F. Boling and C. L. Garber.

ARTICLE VII. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability, direct or contingent, to which this Corporation shall at any time subject itself is Sixteen Thousand dollars (\$16,000.00) which amount does not exceed two-thirds the amount of the capital stock.

ARTICLE VIII. The private property of the stockholders of this Corporation shall be exempt from corporate debts of any kind whatsoever.

ARTICLE IX. At any stockholders' meeting of this Corporation stock may be voted by proxy.
