OSTRICH FEATHER SALES IN LONDON

Report of the Latest One Furnished by T. W. Kemp.

The Republican has from time to time been favored by articles on the ostrich industry, by Thomas W. Kemp of Mesa City who has spent most of his life in connection with it, in South Africa and England. He follows the London feather sales closely as a matter of personal interest and has kindly given The Republican the following report of the latest one. It is of general interest to this valley and of special interest to the many now concerned in the ostrich business.

The ostrich feather sales opened in London on the 27th of March and concluded on the 31st. The quantity offered was heavier than anticipated the amount being 105,500 pounds, realizing \$1,250,000.

The rates ruling show on the whole little change from last sale. Buying was general and competition keen for high class goods. Prime whites were in demand and fine lots brought high prices, the maximum being \$12.50 per pound. This ought to be encouraging to the ostrich farms of the Salt River valley and bears out what I have always advocated, the paying attention to the production of the highest grade of feathers which can be attained by selective breeding and correct treatment and dieting of the birds.

The following is a general summary:

Whites, best lines decidedly dearer; seconds firm, narrow easier. Feminas, first and good fluctuating, 5 per cent higher, other classes with the exception of narrow, lower. Dark femina, no change and only fair demand.

Boos, good quality and length were 10 per cent higher and which has been the case for some time found ready buyers; short, good, firm.

Blacks, long and medium 5 per cent higher; M and S, firm. Drab, long and medium, 5 per cent lower; M and S, firm.

Spadones, the supply of good lines scarce and eagerly competed for; the lower grades show an advance of 5 per cent.

Floss of good length in demand with an upward tendency.

Ostrich feathers to the value of \$5,744,041 were imported into the United States during the past year.

The Salt River valley has more ostriches than the remainder of America and produced during the same period about \$125,000 worth of plumes. Therefore there is no fear of the home grown article exceeding the demand at any rate for many years to come, if ever.

The protective tariff of 20 per cent on the raw article and 6 per cent on the manufactured goods places the industry in this county in a most favorable position.

HIGHLY ESTEEMED IN HIS HOME TOWN

North Adams Herald Tells of the Life of J. Lewis Scott.

The North Adams (Mass.) Herald, which arrived here yesterday, has the following to say concerning the death of J. Lewis Scott, which occurred here last week:

"Joseph Scott, aged 41 years, died yesterday afternoon in Phoenix, Arizona, shortly after The Herald received the announcement of his serious illness. The cause of death was a complication of diseases, kidney trouble being the most pronounced. He had lived in this city 17 years, and was very well and favorably known."

Fifteen years ago he married Miss Laura Bordelieu, the ceremony being performed by Rev. Fr. Ledue at Notre Dame church. The couple went to Newark, N. J., to live for a couple of years before coming here to make their future home. He was a traveling salesman and a barber. At one time he was clerk at the Wilson hotel, and being interested in matters theatrical had been connected with the Richmond theater. He conducted a barber shop in Williams-town a number of years ago, the purchase of the shop bringing Mr. Scott to this section. He was born in Saco, Maine.

About three years and a half ago Mr. Scott's health began to fail and he went west, hoping to be benefited by a more salubrious climate. For a time he improved, and everything indicated a return to his usual health when, a couple of weeks ago, he began to grow weaker and in spite of all that medical science could do, passed away yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Scott, during the time he lived in this city, made many friends by his geniality, his sterling qualities and his true manliness. A man of integrity and worth, his passing away will be keenly felt by all who knew him.

He was a member of the Elks, the Golden Cross lodge and Les Artisans Canadiens. At Phoenix, he was an officer of the Elks' lodge, and that organization has taken charge of the body and will forward it to this city.

Besides his widow, he is survived by a son, Hubert Scott, 14 years old, and a brother, Harry Scott, of New Haven, Conn. The arrangements for the funeral will not be made until the arrival of the body."

PANIC OVER THE PLAGUE.

Definite announcement that the plague had invaded England was made last month in the London Times. The malady asserted itself among the rats in East Anglia and for a time seemed to be spreading itself rapidly over a wide area. Thus a dead rat infected with the bacillus of the disease was found a dozen miles from where the outbreak first asserted itself. In India the particular kind of flea which chiefly carries plague infection from rat to rat is called by the scientific name of *pulex cheopis*. That species seems to be infrequent in England and the United States, although specimens have, we read in London Nature, been found on rats here and in Great Britain. For the time being the attention of experts is directed to ascertaining what other variety of rat parasite is the principal host of the plague bacillus.

The London Times prints a communication from one authority to the effect that rabbits in all countries harbor a flea that conveys the bacillus of plague, but this has not been finally established. It is rather difficult to separate the subjects of plague and rats in the popular mind, observes the British Medical Journal. "These two have been rendered obscure by a kind

of confusion due to the rat panic interjected into the plague panic."

There is still some doubt whether the rat and the plague are invariably associated. Some doubt exists as to whether the flea preying upon the back of the rat conveys the bacillus to man. But first of all we have to find out what is meant by the term plague.

Plague is in reality an acute infective disease, "an infectious fever," to quote the well-known writer on the subject, Dr. R. T. Hewlett, whose paper appears in London Nature. The symptoms in man develop within a few days of infection, according to this authority, whose conclusions and impressions differ somewhat from those of others. The signs of the presence of the malady include fever, headache, giddiness, weakness, with staggering gait, great prostrations and delirium. In three-fourths of the cases the lymphatic glands in the groin, armpit and other regions are inflamed, infiltrated and much enlarged, constituting the "buboes." Hence the name "bubonic" plague. In the remaining cases the lungs may be primarily attacked—the "pneumatic" form—or a severe blood infection may develop—the "septicemic" variety.—Current Literature.
