WOMAN TELLS PITIFUL TALE TO OFFICERS

Mrs. Julia Caldwell Alleges She Was Cruelly Beaten and Driven From Her Homestead Claim by F. B. Williamson.

CASE IS MOST SENSATIONAL ONE

Would Have Spent Last Night in Open Air on Her Claim But She Was Prevented by Severity of Her Injuries.

Mrs. Julia Caldwell, an elderly woman, graduate of Ohio Wesleyan, refined, well spoken and member of an eastern family of high standing, is said to have been brutally beaten by a man yesterday morning in an attempt to defeat her homestead claim in Echo Canyon on Camel Back against his intrusion. F. B. Williamson, a Phoenix man, was charged with the assault and arrested, but is out on bail.

Mrs. Caldwell's house, a small, one-room affair, was moved from her property and her personal belongings scattered about on the mountain side. She intended to return to her claim last night and sleep under a tree, if necessary, to make sure that her title remained good, but her condition was such that she was taken to a hotel and is being cared for by members of the Eastern Star, of which she is a prominent member.

It is seldom that tales of this sort happen outside story books. Mrs. Caldwell, in a state bordering on nervous prostration, suffering from the wrenches and bruises which she said resulted from the conflict with the man, lay on a cot in the sheriff's office and recounted the events of the day.

"I took up this homestead the last of the year," she said. "I was looking around for some sort of a building to use as a dwelling when I was offered a small woodshed owned by Mr. Williamson. In exchange I was to tutor his daughter in those subjects which are taught in the last year of high school. I paid for moving the building and took up my residence on the property January 1.

"Mr. Williamson, his wife, son and daughter all slept there—all of us in the same room—that night. I thought it was to be just for the once and made no objection, but the next day they did not offer to leave, nor the next, nor the next. They just stayed right on.

"A week ago Mr. Williamson ordered me to get out. He told me that my registration had been irregular and that he was going to take up the property. I believe he thinks there is still there. He said he was going to enter a protest.

"I argued with him and told him that I had done nothing irregular and that I intended to stay there. He went away, evidently very angry.
