Interesting Letter Descriptive of Journeys Through Italy and Hungary.

The following interesting letter has been received from Mr. George H. Cook who with Mrs. Cook is making a tour of Europe:

Mr. S. W. Higley, President and Manager of the Arizona Republican.

My Dear Mr. Higley:—After a month of slight feeling in "Sunny Italy" we are having a few days rest at the celebrated water cure.
