DRASTIC ORDER IS ISSUED BY COMMISSION

Railroads Called Together for Hearing on January Thirtieth on Uniform System of Accounting of Revenues and Expense.

BASED ON ORDER OF OKLAHOMA

Every Possible Source of Revenue—Inquired Into As Well As Every Possible Source of Expense.

As a Christmas present to the railroads of Arizona the Arizona corporation commission issued the order for a hearing, which is printed in full herewith. It is probably the most drastic order that has been issued from the left hand group of offices in the Arizona state house in the history of the state. It calls for a uniform system of accounting to be installed in all the railroads. The system is taken almost bodily from the accounting system in force in Oklahoma.

The hearing is set for January 13, 1913, which fortunately is not Friday, but this year falls on Monday. The system proposed, a copy of which was attached to the order in every instance, makes an analytical survey of the revenue of the railroads from every possible source, and also a similar survey of the expenses into every possible department.

It divides the revenue into the three classes most affected in this section, that originating in the state and terminating therein, that terminating in the state and originating elsewhere and that which can be assigned as income because of being carried through the state.

With this system in vogue in every department and every railroad it will be an easy matter for a state examiner to examine the books of the companies at the behest of the corporation commission and obtain all the intimate details of the organization, operation, revenue and expense of the systems.

This is the order: "To All Railroads Doing Business in the State of Arizona: "Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held in the

office of the Arizona corporation commission at Phoenix on Monday, the 13th day of January, 1913, at 10 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of establishing a uniform system of accounting to be adopted by all steam railroads doing business in this state. "The proposed formulae of division of revenue and expense accounts between state and system, passenger, freight, intra-state, inter-state and trans-state business are outlined and designated in the exhibits attached hereto and hereby made a part hereof, will form the basis of said hearing. "ARIZONA CORPORATION COMMISSION.

NEGRO CLUB FOR MILLIONAIRE COLONY

Jack Johnson Plans Resort for his Race on Lake Geneva.

[ASSOCIATED PRESS DISPATCH] CHICAGO, Dec. 23.—The purchase of a summer home and model farm by Jack Johnson, the negro heavyweight pugilist in the exclusive millionaire colony of Lake Geneva, will be followed by the establishment of a negro club there, it was announced today.

A number of acres at the north end of the lake in one of the most desirable portions of the colony, known as the "Newport of the west, were secured by option on December 17 it was stated today by W. G. Anderson, a negro attorney and formerly one of Johnson's counsel. Anderson said he would close the deal tomorrow.

The property is to be owned by a syndicate of ten negroes, associated for the establishment of a club, to be known as the "Lincoln Social Athletic Club." Many social leaders, including some of the wealthiest men of America have summer homes adjoining the negro club property. Mayor Frank Autrosky of Lake Geneva, said tonight he would oppose the establishment of the club.

"I don't think either Johnson or any members of his race will establish themselves in our midst," he said, "but should the move be attempted I will take the case up with the residents. I suppose police powers would cover such a case."

MISSING FARMER DEAD.

NAVY WIRELESS STATION TESTED

Government Tower at Arlington to Be Tried Out By Station on Scout Cruiser; Union Pacific Wants Wireless License.

[ASSOCIATED PRESS DISPATCH] WASHINGTON, Dec. 23.—The final test of the new wireless station for the navy department at Arlington, which is in the hands of the contractors, will be made during next month, when an effort will be made to exchange messages between the station and the scout cruiser Salem, a distance of 2600 miles. Orders have been issued by the navy department for the Salem to fill up her crew so as to be in readiness for the test on January 15.

The ship will put out into the Atlantic and in making the tests will describe a circle, at a radius of about 2000 miles. At the distance called for in the government's contract, the Salem, with its powerful wireless apparatus as any ship in the navy, will be able to respond to any message flashed from the giant towers across the Potomac.

The tests at the new Arlington station have been very satisfactory. While few of these have been made at full capacity, the station at Mare Island navy yard, in California, has been reached and frequent communication has been held with Colon, a distance of 2000 miles.

U. P. Applies for Wireless.

OMAHA, Dec. 23.—The Union Pacific railroad applied today to the department of commerce and labor at Washington for a license to operate and maintain a wireless telegraph system along its lines. Several wireless stations, it is announced, will be constructed when the license is issued.

YOUNG GERMAN FOOLED THEM

Hook Eight New York Sight Drafts to Denver Aggregating \$25,000 and Proceeding to Purchase Everything in Sight.

[ASSOCIATED PRESS DISPATCH] DENVER, Col., Dec. 23.—Possessed of eight sight drafts aggregating \$25,000 on the Lincoln Trust company of New York, Johann Miller, aged 26 years old, arrived in Denver a week ago and bought almost everything offered him, tonight rests in jail, protesting he is a son of a wealthy German land owner, although to the Lincoln Trust company, a stranger in Denver is a stranger in New York.

Miller began by purchasing a big touring car, giving as part payment a check for \$500 which he drew against one Lincoln Trust company draft for \$2000 deposited for collection with the Central Savings Bank here. Another draft \$19,000 was placed in the Denver National Bank for collection. Then he journeyed to Fort Lupton where he sold his machine and considered the purchase of a ranch. One draft \$6000 another of \$2500 were placed with the Fort Lupton Bank for collection. He decided then he needed an electric automobile and gave a check for \$600 on the remainder of the \$2000 draft that he had left for collection with the clerk of the Central Savings Bank.

NEGRO BANDIT SHOT

[ASSOCIATED PRESS DISPATCH] TULSA, Okla., Dec. 23.—An unidentified negro was shot and instantly killed while attempting to rob the crew and passengers of a St. Louis and San Francisco train bound from Oklahoma City to Kansas City, shortly after it left Chandler, Okla., tonight. It is said the negro had killed another negro before boarding the train. The bandit was shot by an operative of a detective agency, who was a passenger.

ANDRADE CASE IS REVERSED

Supreme Court Handed Down Two Long Opinions on Noted Cases Reversing One and Affirming the Other.

The supreme court got busy yesterday and issued two opinions, one of which was on the famous Andrade divorce case and the other on the also well known Levy family fuss about real estate. The first case came up from Yuma county, while the second was from Cochise, Douglas being the city beautiful in which the litigated real property is situated. The Andrade case was reversed and ordered dismissed, while the judgment in the Levy case was affirmed. The Andrade case is well known because of the prominence of the parties at issue. Albert F. Andrade is the general manager of the Inter-California railway, which runs from Yuma to Calexico. He originally sued for divorce and obtained it. This was a decree granted by the district court of Yuma county on October 5, 1910. Mrs. Andrade afterward had this set aside and the order vacated on the grounds that it was obtained through fraud. Following this Andrade instituted additional proceedings, and in Mrs. Andrade's answer she opposed the action, but asked for separate maintenance. Andrade was granted the divorce, but no provision was made for the maintenance of Mrs. Andrade. From this decree she appealed to the supreme court, and it was this decree that was yesterday set aside, reversed and ordered dismissed.

The court considered in arriving at the reversing opinion the assignments of error alleged by the appellant that Andrade was not a resident of Yuma at the time the divorce was granted; that the court erred in holding that Mrs. Andrade was guilty of wilful desertion because a letter was produced in evidence from Andrade dated Calexico in which he said Mrs. Andrade could live anywhere and do as she pleased and it would not be considered by him as grounds for divorce. The supreme court held the evidence failed to sustain the charges of Andrade.

On the Levy case the court decided that the trial court in finding Levy had given up his right to the certain holdings which he had theretofore transferred to his minor children was correct and sustained the contentions of the heirs.
