ORDINANCE NO 13
(Continued from Page Nine.)

be revoked, and all moneys theretofore paid upon such license fees or taxes therefor shall be forfeited to the city. The Commission may also revoke any such license whenever the holder or holders of the same, or any of his, their, or its, servants, agents, or employees, shall violate or neglect, fail or refuse to observe and obey any provisions of any ordinance or resolution of the City of Phoenix relative to the sale or disposition of vinous, malt, distilled or intoxicating liquors, or whenever the holder of such license shall be convicted of any felony or be guilty of any act of

moral turpitude, or of any other act or conduct which the Commission may or shall deem to be injurious, detrimental or a menace to the public health, morals or safety.

No wholesale liquor dealer's license, retail liquor dealer's license of the first class, retail liquor dealer's license of the second class or saloon keeper's license shall hereafter be issued or renewed to any person who has theretofore held a liquor dealer's license of any kind, character or class, and which has been revoked for cause, nor to any firm, association or corporation in which such person is or may be directly or indirectly interested, and where such license has been or may be issued to any person, firm, association or corporation in which such person whose liquor license has been revoked for cause shall thereafter become directly or indirectly interested, such license shall be forthwith revoked and all moneys paid thereon for license fees or taxes shall be forfeited to the city.

Sec. 10. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, and only to the extent that they are in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed; provided, however, that no license fee or tax due or owing, or no fine, forfeiture or penalty under existing ordinances at the time when this ordinance takes effect, shall be affected hereby; but the punishment of violations and the recovery of license fees, taxes, fines and forfeitures shall remain and take place in the same manner and to the same extent as if the ordinances or parts of ordinances repealed hereby had continued or remained in force; and in every case where an offense is committed prior to the time this ordinance takes effect, the offender shall be tried under the ordinance in force when the offense was committed, and if convicted, punished under such ordinance, and all existing rights and remedies for the collection or recovery of such license tax or fee shall continue in like manner as if this ordinance had not been passed, and the provisions of the existing ordinance or ordinances as to punishment to be inflicted or the mode of trial or the manner of determining the penalty for the offense committed before this ordinance takes effect and the provisions of the existing ordinance or ordinances as to the collection or recovery of license fees or taxes shall not be affected by such repeal of any existing ordinance or ordinances.

Sec. 11. Whereas, the proper regulation of the sale and disposition of intoxicating liquors is essential to the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and it is necessary that this ordinance take immediate effect, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor, and is hereby exempted from the operation of the referendum provision of the City Charter.

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PHOENIX, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING OF VOCATIONS, TRADES, CALLINGS, PROFESSIONS AND BUSINESSES CARRIED ON IN THE CITY OF PHOENIX," APPROVED MAY 22, 1914.

WHEREAS, on the 22nd day of May, 1914, the Commission of the City of Phoenix passed that certain ordinance designated as "Ordinance No. 6" and entitled "An Ordinance to Provide for the Licensing of Vocations, Trades, Callings, Professions and Businesses carried on in the City of Phoenix;" and,

WHEREAS, before the expiration of thirty days after the passage of said ordinance by said Commission a petition signed by qualified electors of the city equal in number to at least ten per cent of the entire vote cast for all candidates for mayor at the last preceding general municipal election at which a mayor was elected in said City of Phoenix, protesting against the passage of said ordinance as a whole, was presented to the Commission of the City of Phoenix; and,

WHEREAS, upon the filing of said petition said ordinance became, and is now, suspended from going into operation, and the Commission has determined to reconsider and repeal said ordinance; Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PHOENIX, as follows:

Sec. 1. That that certain ordinance of the City of Phoenix designated as "Ordinance No. 6" and entitled "An Ordinance to Provide for the Licensing of Vocations, Trades, Callings, Professions and Businesses Carried on in the City of Phoenix," approved May 22, 1914, be, and the same is hereby, reconsidered and repealed as a whole.

Sec. 2. WHEREAS, this ordinance requires early operation in order to preserve the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor, and is hereby exempted from the operation of the referendum provision of the City Charter.

ORDINANCE NO. 15.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE BURIAL OF THE BODIES OF HUMAN BEINGS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PHOENIX.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PHOENIX, as follows:

Sec. 1. It is hereby declared a nuisance, and it shall be unlawful for any person to bury the body of a human being within the corporate limits of the City of Phoenix.

Sec. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not to exceed three hundred dollars, or shall be imprisoned in the city jail not to exceed three hundred days, or shall suffer both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 3. WHEREAS, the burial of dead bodies within the city limits is unsanitary and detrimental to the public health; therefore, in order to preserve the public health and safety an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor, and is hereby exempted from the operation of the referendum provision of the City Charter.
