Said Bonds being in denomination of Five Hundred Dollars each, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) and bearing interest at the rate of not exceeding six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually. Said bonds to be dated August first, 1914, and payable twenty years from the date thereof. Both principal and interest payable in Gold Coin, Lawful Money of the United States at the office of the Treasurer of Maricopa County.

RESOLUTION 31

A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PHOENIX DECLARING THEIR INTENTION TO IMPROVE THE ALLEY IN BLOCK EIGHTY-ONE (81) OF THE ORIGINAL TOWNSITE OF THE CITY OF PHOENIX AND DETERMINING THAT BONDS SHALL BE ISSUED TO COVER THE COSTS AND EXPENSES THEREOF AND DECLARING THE WORK OR IMPROVEMENT TO BE OF MORE THAN ORDINARY PUBLIC BENEFIT AND THAT THE WORK SHALL BE ASSESSED UPON A DISTRICT AND PROVIDING THAT THE PROPOSED WORK OR IMPROVEMENT SHALL BE DONE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 1912, AND SUBSEQUENT AMENDMENTS.

passed by the Commission of the City of Phoenix at a meeting held July 9th, 1914, and that a quorum was present thereat.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PHOENIX:

Section 1. That the public interests and convenience require and it is the intention of the Commission of the City of Phoenix to order the following work to be done, to-wit:

(1) That the alley in Block Eighty-one (81) of the Original Townsite of Phoenix, except such portions of said alley which are or will be occupied by walks and excepting also such portion of said alley as will be occupied by cement concrete gutter where shown on the plans hereinafter referred to, be graded and paved with bitulithic pavement.

(2) That a cement concrete gutter be built along the center line of the alley in Block Eighty-one (81) of the Original Townsite of Phoenix.

(3) That a gravel walk four (4) feet in width be built along the South side of said alley from the West line of Third Avenue. West, approximately One-hundred and ten (110) feet.

(4) That a concrete gutter be built across the aforesaid gravelled walk at a point approximately One-hundred and ten (110) feet West of the westerly line of Third Avenue.

(5) All of the above work to be done in accordance with a certain set of plans approved and adopted by the Commission of the City of Phoenix on the 9th day of July 1914, and on file in the office of the City Engineer of said City, in Book Two (2) of Street Improvement Plans, on Page 59, and in further accordance with specifications, Numbers 19, 20, and 21 of the City of Phoenix, on file in the office of the City Clerk, of said City and which plans and specifications are hereby referred to for more particular description of the said work and made a part hereof.

Section 2. That the said contemplated work or improvement in the opinion of the Commission is of more than local or ordinary public benefit and said Commission hereby makes the costs and expenses of said work or improvement chargeable upon a district and hereby declares that the district in said City of Phoenix benefited by said work or improvement and to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof is described as follows:

All of Block Eighty-one (81) of the Original Townsite of Phoenix.

Section 3. The City Engineer is hereby directed to make a diagram of the district described hereinabove in Section 2 of this Resolution of Intention, to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof. Such diagram shall show each separate lot, piece or parcel of land in said district and the relative location of the same to the work proposed to be done.

Section 4. The said Commission finds that public convenience requires that serial bonds shall be issued to represent the costs and expenses of such work or improvement and said Commission determines that serial bonds shall be issued to represent each assessment of Twenty-five (25) Dollars or more for the costs and expenses of such work or improvement. Said serial bonds shall extend over a period ending nine (9) years from and after the second day of January next succeeding the date of said bonds, and an even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable by coupon on the second day of January every year after their date until all is paid and the interest shall be payable semi-annually by coupon on the second day of January and July respectively, of each year, at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum on all sums unpaid until the whole of said principal sum and interest are paid.

Section 5: The serial bonds herein mentioned shall be issued in accordance with the provisions of an act of the Legislature of the State of Arizona, known and designated as the "Improvement Act of 1912," approved May 17, 1912, and all the proceedings in the aforementioned improvements shall also be taken under said "Improvement Act of 1912," and subsequent amendments.

Section 6. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this Resolution of Intention, and shall cause the same to be published ten (10) times in the Arizona Republican, a daily newspaper published and circulated in the City of Phoenix and hereby designated for that purpose.

Section 7. The Superintendent of Streets of the City of Phoenix shall post notice of said proposed improvement as required by law, and in said notices shall refer to this Resolution of Intention. Reference is hereby made to the Bitulithic Mixtures License Agreement of Warren Brothers Company of Boston, Mass., dated June 15, 1914, on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Phoenix.
