

ALLIED HELP DOES NOT REACH THE SERBIANS

Except for French Contingent Stiffening Serbian Line in Region of Strumitsa, Allied Reinforcements Have Not Arrived

AUSTRIANS AFTER MONTENEGRINS

Are Exerting Renewed Pressure Along Drina, This Movement Co-ordinating With Teutonic Offensive in Balkans

LONDON, Oct. 30.—Serbia remains the center of interest.

The French contingent stiffening the Serbian line in the region of Strumitsa, the allied reinforcements have not reached the hard-pressed and retreating Serbians, which only the mountainous country is saving from annihilation.

The Montenegrians are being hammered by the Austrians, who are exerting renewed pressure along the Drina, near Visegrad, the movement co-ordinating with the general Teutonic offensive in the Balkans.

THOUSANDS GUARD BORDER AGAINST MEXICAN BULLETS

Sixth United States Infantry Brigade is Entrenched Few Feet from Border Ready to Interfere if Expected Attack on Carranza Garrison at Agua Prieta by Villa Army Today or Tomorrow Should Result in Shooting into American Territory

DOUGLAS, Oct. 30.—

Three thousand men of the Sixth United States Infantry Brigade have been placed in the trenches within a few feet of the Mexican border ready to interfere if the expected attack on the Carranza garrison at Agua Prieta by the Villa army on Sunday or Monday should result in shooting into American territory.

"I do not propose to see any American town shot up," he said. Anticipating a battle tomorrow or Monday, General Davis has issued instructions to the people on the American side of the boundary to keep within doors, get behind adobe walls and not trust wooden barriers to keep out the high-powered bullets.
