## RECRUITABLE MAXIMUM IS NEEDED

### PREMIER ASQUITH REVEALS ALLIES' MILITARY POSITION

#### Delivers Long Expected Speech in House of Commons in Connection With Introduction of Supplementary Estimate of Army's Needs.

#### EVERY FIT MAN SHOULD ENLIST

#### Premier Does Not Go On Record For or Against Conscription But John Redmond Says Nationalists Will Oppose.

LONDON, Dec. 21.—Premier Asquith made his long expected statement on the allies' military position in the house of commons today in connection with the introduction of a supplementary estimate providing for the raising of the maximum strength of the British army from 3,000,000 men to 4,000,000 men.

The house was crowded and the premier's speech was listened to eagerly and silently. In the peevish gallery, Lord Fisher, the former first sea lord, and Earl Derby, director of recruits, occupied the most prominent position above the clerk.

## GENERAL DE WET OUT OF PRISON

LONDON, Dec. 21.—General Christian de Wet, one of the leaders of the South African rebellion against the British, escaped from the 1914 jail which was convicted of treason at Stone Mountain, Union of South Africa, last June, has been released from prison, as have 118 other high treason prisoners, according to a despatch to Reuters, Telegram Company from Johannesburg.

## INFORMAL NEGOTIATIONS ARE ONLOOKING TO SETTLEMENT OF THE ANCONA CONTROVERSY

### WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.—Pending receipt of American reply to the second American note regarding the sinking of the Italian steamship Ancona, Baron Erich Zwielenick, charge of the Austro-Hungarian embassy, is negotiating informally with Secretary Lansing for an amicable settlement of the controversy. An intimation to that effect was received at the state department today after the charge had conferred at some length with the secretary.

It is understood Baron Zwielenick is attempting negotiations similar to those conducted by Count von Bernstorff, the German ambassador, following the sinking of the steamship Arabic. It is considered probable, however, that such negotiations can develop to any important stage until after receipt of the next formal communication from Austria-Hungary which is expected some time within the next week.

Just what authority Baron Zwielenick has been given by his government has not been made known. It was recalled today that relations between the United States and Germany were seriously strained when the German ambassador was given virtually a free hand to conduct the negotiations. In some official quarters, the better prevails that it was the negotiations conducted by Count von Bernstorff which prevented the situation from becoming more serious than it at one time admittedly was. ## BOTH SIDES RIO GRANDE LINED WITH TROOPS AFTER JUAREZ RIOTING

### OBREGON AT NOGALES ON WAY TO EL PASO

[Republican A. P. Leased Wire] EL PASO, Tex., Dec. 21.—Heavily armed Mexican and American troops lined opposite banks of the Rio Grande tonight as the result of rioting in Juarez.

One shot from south of the border, believed by the United States military authorities to have been fired on American troops topped George A. DeForest of El Paso, an American, from the top of an El Paso and Southern river railroad freight car. He was dead with a bullet in his heart when a corporal's guard reached him. His train mates fled at the shot. Later the train was pulled out of range of Mexican snipers that moved along the bank of the Rio Grande.

## ONLY INCIDENT NOT AFFECTING THE SITUATION

## YAQUIS THREATEN AMERICANS TROOPS RUSHED TO SAN PEDRO

Leased Wire] GUAYMAS, Mex., (By radio to San Diego, Cal., Dec. 21.—General Madrid and Estrada left here today with twelve carloads of troops for the American settlement at San Pedro. Some of the Yaqui Indians were reported yesterday and where fighting is reported still in progress. Another troop train of 28 cars passed through Hermosillo early today and General Obregon today ordered 60 cars made ready to carry troops south.
