LEWIS OUTPOINTS RITCHIE ALL WAY

English Lightweight Master of Ex-Champ in Nine of Ten Rounds

[Republican A. P. Leased Wire] NEW YORK, Dec. 28.—Ted (Kid) Lewis of England, outpointed Willie Ritchie of San Francisco in every round except one of their ten round bout at Madison Square Garden tonight.

Ritchie was the aggressor at the outset of every round but failed to follow up his advantage with force or cleverness sufficiently to mark him as the master of the Englishman. Only in the third round did Ritchie have anything like an even break with his opponent.

Ritchie was willing all of the way, showing pluck and at the end of the bout appeared to have lost little of his spirit. Ritchie's only mistake was a left jab to the face, but Lewis used left and right hooks at will and his feet footwork made it difficult for the Californian to land an effective blow.

Lewis' most effective attack was a short left arm jab to the head which Ritchie seemed unable to avoid and suffered as a consequence. Lewis was unmarked at the end of the bout but Ritchie, besides having a cut over his right eye, bore evidences of the losing end of a fast encounter. Lewis weighed 135 7/8 and Ritchie 143 3/4.

This morning the day class headed by Norman Cheney will play George Gross's Spaghetti, made up of the night gym class.



RAINEY HAS PLAN FOR DEFENSE FUND



Representative Henry T. Rainey of Illinois, veteran Democratic member of the house ways and means committee, has prepared a tentative program of revenue legislation designed to produce \$302,650,000 to finance the president's plan for national preparedness. His program includes a tax on gasoline, freight and express, readjustment of the income tax rates and exemptions, retention of the duty on sugar, a tax on coffee, tea, burials and bananas, and the re-enactment of the present so-called war revenue laws.

That a combined concrete curb and gutter be built along both sides of the roadway of Jefferson Street from the east line of Seventh Avenue to a point fifty feet east of the east line of Ninth Avenue excepting along the north side between the east line of Eighth Avenue and the west line of Seventeenth Avenue and excepting also at the intersections of streets, alleys, private drives and approaches thereto as shown on the plans hereinafter referred to.

That a combined concrete curb and gutter be built along the sides of the roadway at the intersection of the following Avenues with Jefferson Street between the east line of Seventh Avenue and a point fifty feet east of the east line of Ninth Avenue on both sides at Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, Sixteenth, Seventeenth and Eighteenth Avenues on the south side of Jefferson Street at Eleventh Avenue as shown on the plans hereinafter referred to.
