CHEVROLET AND BUICK MERGE TO SING PRAISE OF GRAPE FRUIT

Babbitt - Polson Company Buys Local Buick Agency; First Gun in Statewide Campaign on Sale of Two Famous Makes

Just as the parent manufacturers have merged through a recent gigantic financial deal, so have the local agencies for the Chevrolet and Buick cars become commingled. In a deal that is by far the most important in automobile circles here in many months, the Babbitt-Polson company of Williams, agents for Arizona for the Chevrolet, has purchased the W. W. Catlin company, agents for the Buick in central Arizona. J. S. Amundsen, manager, who has been here a week, closed the deal. "Billy" Catlin remains with the new concern as Buick sales and service agent for the north and central portions of the state. W. E. Gardner, who established the local Chevrolet agency for the Babbitt-Polson company will assume charge of Chevrolet sales and service here.

In the state-wide organization that is planned by the B-P company, Chevrolet and Buick service will be installed in every important locality. The holding company is one of the most important mercantile firms in the state, and is credited with doing a larger business than any other similar firm. Within a few days, the Chevrolet plant will be moved from East Washington street to the present Buick home at 315 North Central avenue. Catlin has conducted the Buick business with entire success for several years. He came here as a salesman for another concern, but saw the opportunity for selling Buicks, and bought the business from R. D. Hooper who had succeeded the Ferguson company. Gardner is a north of the state man, who has made a wide acquaintance during the short time he has been operating in this section.

In addition to the two lines of automobiles, the big display rooms will be used to show the General Motors trucks, a line that will be pushed as one of the coming makes of commercial vehicles.

Effort Will Be Made by Producers to Acquaint Valley Residents With Superior Qualities of the Arizona Product Next Week

Saturday, February 25, will be grape fruit day throughout the Salt River valley. Forth he that gives and he that receives shall be blessed. Spring is an especially good time to eat grape fruit. STORY BOOSTS ARE BEST, SAYS BIXBEE

Chamber of Commerce Supplies Valuable Publicity Through Recognized Farm Journals

Of all the good publicity the Salt River valley gets, there is none that is so beneficial and so well fitted to bring settlers here as that which appears in the form of articles in the big farm journals. This is according to Assistant Secretary Bixbee of the chamber of commerce, who calls attention to the two articles in the California Cultivator for February 17. One concerns oranges and is by Harry Welch. The longer one is a resume of the citrus industry and is from the pen of State Entomologist A. W. Morrill. "We get the maximum of inquiries as a result of these articles," said Bixbee. "In one case, a man had written for literature, basing his letter on an article that appeared in Hoards' Dairyman. We sent him the literature and were just writing him again with supplementary information, when he blew into the office. He happened to have a herd of finely bred cattle, all ready to put onto a piece of valley land. There was a citizen worth interesting in the local field."

WILL AID ALIENS TO BE NATURALIZED

The Packard Motor Car company has announced that it will pay the fees required of any of its alien employees who may desire to take out first papers toward American citizenship. This follows the announcement made January 21 to the effect that only American citizens or those of foreign birth who have relinquished their foreign citizenship and who have filed their applications for citizenship, will be given promotions to positions of importance, and that loyalty to the United States is a prerequisite to employment.

The company offers practical help in training foreign-born employees to become citizens. One class in English for foreigners is being conducted several nights a week at the factory, and two more classes are in preparation.

CHALMERS HAS NEW PLAN FOR CAR SALES

Wires received from Paul Smith, vice president of the Chalmers Selling Division, indicate the entire success of the four Chalmers sales conventions which are being held in the south and southwest during the month of February.

"Dealers are enthusiastic over the new Chalmers finance plan, which permits the sale of cars on time with only the banking rate of interest," was the substance of Mr. Smith's first wire sent in from Kansas City. "We are backing the big convention held for two sessions a day, and the dealers state that the new plan will boost sales fifty per cent."

The new plan referred to by Vice-president Smith, was announced at the Chicago Automobile show. Under the arrangement the buyer of a car can secure immediate delivery by payment of a portion of the list price. He is required to pay only 6 per cent interest on the notes he gives for the balance, as compared with the much higher interest previously charged in plans of this kind.
