

FOUR ENTRIES SECURED FOR INTERNATIONAL MOTORCYCLE RACE FROM SONORA CAPITAL

Speed Commissioner Boido Secures Unqualified Endorsement of State Fair Commission for Big Fall Contest

RACE TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 9-10

Hour Race for F. A. M. Championship Lost, but Another Award Looked for as Top Liner on Speed Program at Fair

Unqualified endorsement has been given the proposed International Motorcycle race from Hermosilla, Sonora to Phoenix, Arizona, since the idea was first made public through The Republican last week.

Dr. L. Boido of this city, who conceived the idea as a response to Sonora's appeal for better understanding between the two states, yesterday received the following letter of authorization:

"In accordance with our conversation of recent date, relative to a motorcycle road race starting at Hermosilla, Mexico and terminating at Phoenix, Arizona just prior to the Annual State Fair in November, permit me to advise you that you are authorized by the State Fair Commission to make all arrangements for this event, and that you may count upon the hearty cooperation of the State Fair Commission in promoting and financing an international race between the cities above mentioned.

"We feel that a race of this kind will be of extraordinary interest to the people interested in motor contests and that it will have a definite effect in promoting a better feeling and understanding between the people of the two countries."

T. D. Shaughnessy, Secretary State Fair Commission. Four local riders yesterday definitely announced their intention of becoming entrants. They are Bob O'put and Edgar Orr. Both feel that the International Motorcycle Race is the most worthwhile contest of its kind ever proposed. An attempt will be made to secure several entries among the Mexican boys who ride motorcycles.

Harold Wells and Bob Bennett are also to be entries. Both ride Indians, while the first two will mount Harley's.
