

RAINY DAY GROUP TO BE DEVELOPED

He also states that a cross-cut run from the upper tunnel, capped a good ore shoot, and the vein being tapped at a lower point, leads to development having been decided upon to fully establish that condition. LaBarre has owned the property for over eight years, and from a small wage earning has accomplished a remarkable mine showing, under the burdens to face him. The prospective buyers are soon to arrive to make another examination, their engineers reporting favorably at different time during the past two years. LaBarre has the best city yesterday to purchase a big line of supplies and prepare for enlarging his camp facilities. 1/2
