FINANCES AND MARKETS

[Republican A. P. Leased Wire] NEW YORK, Sept. 9.—(Wall Street)—The unfavorable crop conditions disclosed by yesterday's government report were without effect upon today's extremely active, broad and very strong market, except in so far as they had a tendency to check any movement in grain and northwestern issues.

Shares of eastern roads, as well as Pacific and trunk lines, were strong. A more significant feature was attached to the movement in United States Steel, which rose 4 points to the new record of 43 3/4. This was prior to the publication of August tonnage increase. 

The noteworthy feature of the weekly bank statement was the decrease of \$26,000,000 in actual reserves, making a total contraction of almost \$56,000,000 for the past fortnight.

CLEARING HOUSES

NEW YORK, Sept. 9.—The statement of the actual condition of clearing house banks and trust companies for the week shows that they held \$69,501,970 reserve in excess of legal requirements. This is a decrease of \$26,000,000 from last week. The statement follows:

Actual condition: Loans, discounts, etc., \$3,305,602,000; increase, \$13,265,990. Reserve in vaults (B), \$401,136,000; decrease, \$10,448,000. Reserve in federal reserve banks, \$171,050,000; increase, \$9,464,000.

NEW YORK, Sept. 9.—Continued firmness was noted in the market for copper. Supplies available for November deliveries have been pretty well cleaned up with sales reported at 2,284 for the week. Today's quotations for December and deliveries after the first of the year ranged from \$28.00 down to \$27.50. Iron was unchanged.

NEW YORK, Sept. 9.—The market for sugar futures was steadier this morning and prices closed two to six points not higher on covering for the week-end and some demand from brokers with foreign connections. LITTLE DAISY RECLAIMS THREE AND HALF MILLION POUNDS OF COPPER IN MONTH OF AUGUST

PRESIDENT, ARIZ., Sept. 9.—Sampler and smelter returns indicate the reclamation of 3,500,000 pounds of copper from United Verde Extension (Little Daisy), ore during the month of August.
