

FORMER GOVERNORS OPPOSING COUNSEL IN SUIT BY WOMEN

Two former governors were opposing counsel in a civil action before Judge Stanford yesterday and both the plain-

... and defendant were women. The suit was brought by Mrs. Anna J. Blackburn who was represented by Judge Richard E. Sloan against Mrs. Louise S. Webb, whose counsel was Judge Joseph H. Kibbey. The court instructed the jury to return a sealed verdict, therefore the outcome will not be known until the opening of court at 9:30 o'clock this morning. The plaintiff alleges that she leased certain lands to the defendant for a period of three years, Mrs. Webb taking possession of the property on January 1, 1919. The rent, according to the contract, she says, was placed at \$3,000 and the payments were to be \$600 semi-annually. The first payment was

due July 1, 1918, and the second on January 1, 1919. At the present time, she alleged, only \$583 has been paid. According to the defendant, the plaintiff had agreed to pay to have a well, filled in, which interfered with the cultivation of the land and which Mrs. Webb had done at her own expense and deducted from the initial rental. She made additional claim that she had been damaged by the failure of Mrs. Blackburn to build a headgate and additional damage caused by shade trees which retarded the growth of the crops which the defendant claims the plaintiff alleged she could have trimmed and which she later learned were not on her property. The damage she estimated at \$120 which she agreed to deduct from the second payment and which was refused by the plaintiff.

SAYS HUSBAND USED GUN TO RUN HOUSE

That he threatened her roomers at the point of a gun and finally turned the weapon on his wife when she remonstrated with him was the testimony offered in Justice Wheeler's court yesterday by Mrs. Martha Agerado at the trial of her husband of a month and a half.

The complaining witness said she was conducted a rooming house on East Jackson when she married Lazaro Agerado. He worked for a week after the marriage and purchased a gun with the money he earned.

Armed with the weapon Agerado is alleged to have approached the roomers, declaring he was tired of having the men around. According to his wife he stated that he would be the one to run that house.

Mrs. Agerado then took steps to have Agerado arrested, the warrant being sworn out in the court where the couple was married a few weeks before. Justice Wheeler, who performed the ceremony, yesterday sentenced Agerado to 30 days in the county jail for threatening to commit an offense against the person of his wife.
