Strict Enforcement of New Merchant Marine Act Will Abrogate Treaties With at Least Ten Nations

WASHINGTON, Aug. 31.—Examination by the state department of commercial treaties to which the United States is a signatory, has revealed that between 24 and 27 of such pacts may have to be abrogated under the new merchant marine act, it was said tonight by department officials.
