DUCK AND QUAIL IN FULL RETREAT WHEN NIMRODS OPEN DRIVE

"Scatter gun" artists who went out in search of quail yesterday morning were returning home early in the afternoon with the limit, a very good indication that the birds are plentiful this season. Yesterday being the opening day of the season, hundreds of hunters were out, and there will be just as many out today and tomorrow.

With the duck season opening this morning at daybreak, the reason for so much noise along the rivers, sloughs and flooded fields was due to the fact that the Nimrods were back at their old game trying to fool the ducks with decoys and duck calls. After bringing them down within shooting range they fired, getting perhaps ten or fifteen out of each flock as they flew over sounds reasonable. This is a great pastime, and sportsmen will participate in the great out-door life for the next three or four weeks, as the season is now open on all game including rabbits, doves, white wings, ducks, quail, turkey and deer.

While some are worrying about a good place to go in an effort to bag the limit on quail or ducks, others are going out to locate a secret spot. The ducks are coming into the valley in large flocks, and the quail are found in greater quantities than ever before. It is very easy to leave Phoenix in any direction and return home with the limit.

According to the state law it is necessary for every shooter to have a hunting license in order to kill game, these licenses being for sale in local

sporting goods stores, or at the game warden's office at the capital. The game laws are as follows:

Small Game
Quail—Oct. 15 to Dec. 31. (Bag limit in possession 20.)
Ducks, geese, cots, jacksnipes—Oct. 15 to Jan. 31. (Bag limit 20.)
Doves and whistlings—July 15 to Dec. 31. (Bag limit 25.)
Blackbreasted and golden plover and yellowlegs—Oct. 15 to Dec. 15. (Bag limit 20.)

Fish
Halls—Oct. 15 to Nov. 30.
Trout, 7 inches or over—June 1 to Sept. 1. (Bag limit 25.)
All other fish, 7 inches or over—Jan. 1 to Dec. 31.

Big Game
Male deer with horns—Oct. 1 to Nov. 1. (Bag limit 1 per person.)
Wild turkey—Oct. 1 to Nov. 1. (Bag limit, 2 per person.)


There is no open season on antelope, elk, mountain sheep, female deer or fawn, roadrunners, bobwhite, grouse, pheasant, song and insectivorous birds, handbilled pigeon, little brown sandhill, whooping crane, wood duck, swan, curlew, willet, and all shore birds except those for which an open season is given above.

HERO OF TRIPLE PLAY AND DIAGRAM OF PLAY



CLEVELAND—Here's Bill Wambagans and a diagram showing how he made the first triple play unassisted ever recorded in a world series and the second triple play in major league history. Brooklyn batters set the stage in the fifth inning. Kilduff first man to face Pitcher Bagby, singled to left. Miller tapped a single to center. With Kilduff resting on second and Miller perched on first, Pitcher Mitchell, who had replaced Grimes, lined straight to Wambagans (first out). Wambagans darted to second after the catch, and touched the bag, retiring Kilduff, who

was on his way to third (second out). Wambagans then touched Miller, who ran for second (third out).

The only other triple play in the major league baseball was made by Neal Ball, shortstop for the old Cleveland team, in a game against the Boston Red Sox on July 10, 1909. Ball's feat was made at League Park also. Ball took a liner, doubled his second man at second base and tagged his third victim coming to second. Neither Ball nor Wambagans realized that a triple play was being made when their respective plays started.

Game Killed in Mexico Must Be Duly Certified

State Game Warden Prochaska has returned from a business visit to the border where he went to investigate rumors that hunters were crossing the border with game killed in Mexico.

The Arizona game laws prohibit the possession of slain deer, deer hides, deer heads or venison, except under certain limitations. But one deer may be killed in a season by a single hunter and having possession of venison, etc., beyond the legal limit is prohibited and the possessor is subject to a fine and seizure of the game or any part of it. An exception is made of venison bought from another country, but that fact must be established.

Mr. Prochaska's mission to the border was for the purpose of arranging that all prohibited game coming out of old Mexico be supplied with proof of that fact in the form of regular consular invoice and custom entries at the international line. The game warden and his deputies will seize all game not protected by such evidence, subject to the Arizona game law.

Warden Prochaska says the department has been lax in enforcing this provision of the law in the past, but in the future all violators of the law will be prosecuted.

TEMPE-MESA GAME AT TEMPE SUNDAY—DANCE AT FOREST PARK TUES.

Tempe and Mesa will cross bats again Sunday afternoon at Tempe. The clubs staged an interesting contest at Mesa last Sunday and the boys expect to improve with each game.

COAST LEAGUE MAY ECLIPSE SCANDAL OF WORLD SERIES

Doran, chief deputy district attorney, who is directing the investigation begun today by the Los Angeles county grand jury into alleged corruption in Pacific coast baseball league games.

Mr. Doran stated evidence already given the investigators indicated scores of games were "thrown" for money last season.

BASEBALL PROBE TO OPEN NEXT TUESDAY

CHICAGO, Oct. 15.—The Cook county grand jury investigating the baseball scandal today subpoenaed Arnold Rothstein of New York and three St. Louis men to appear before it Tuesday. Rothstein will be asked particularly, it was said, concerning any talks he may have had with Abe Attell or Bill Burns concerning the possibility of "fixing" the 1919 world series.

The St. Louis men called are Harry Redmond, Joseph Pasch and Thomas C. Kearney.

It was said that they would be asked to substantiate the testimony of "Kid" Gleason, Chicago American league club manager, concerning a trip he made to St. Louis last fall to investigate possible crookedness in the series.
