CONTRACT S LET FOR EXCAVATING FOR NEW \$400,000 ELKS HOME

MEXICO OFFERS BIG OPPORTUNITY TO U. S. CAMERON DECLARES

By establishing industrial enterprises in Mexico the United States could secure absolute control of the trade of that country. This is the consensus of opinion of government officials and business men of Mexico...

"I am convinced that Oregon is anxious to develop the amazing resources of Mexico and realizes the vital importance of establishing friendly relations with the United States," was Senator Cameron's comment.

"Oregon is for the advancement and uplift of Mexico. He realizes that the mere granting of land to the lower element of Mexican society will not bring about the results desired. To induce prosperous conditions he proposes colonizing the lower strata of Mexican society, furnishing homes equipped with modern conveniences, and inculcating into the natives an ambition to rise above their present squalor and filth."

In analyzing conditions as he found them in Mexico, Senator Cameron said General Oregon is recognizing the importance of encouraging foreign immigration at this time. The government now offers free transportation from the border to point of destination for colonists, free importation of machinery, household goods and livestock and 50 per cent reduction on freight rates.

Touching upon the agricultural possibilities in Mexico, Senator Cameron referred to an exhaustive report on the subject recently submitted by an authority (who requests his name withheld) to Antonio Villareal, secretary of agriculture. This report makes the following recommendation: "It is, therefore, absolutely necessary

On the part of the Mexican government and its people to give its greatest consideration to the encouraging of foreign immigration into Mexico." Colonization of the millions of fertile acres of Mexico by Americans is especially desired, according to Senator Cameron, which is now making investments in the state of Chihuahua and is now returning to Russia to make its report, and that the Mennonites of Canada recently sent a third delegation into Mexico, which is now making investments. While not discouraging these immigrants, the leaders of the Mexican government expressed their preference for the incursion of progressive agriculturists from the United States.

Regarding commercial conditions Senator Cameron found the hardware and agricultural business controlled by the Germans, the grocery and provision markets by the Spanish. "Active development of its resources would enable Mexico to pay off its debt within two years," was the opinion expressed by Senator Cameron, who pointed out that its 30,000,000 acres of pine and oak forests possess sufficient timber to pay off the national debt. There are also extensive forests of hardwoods such as mahogany and cedar. Attention was also called to the great oil fields now in the infancy of development, and the resources of silver, antimony, lead and other precious minerals.

Returning from Mexico Senator Cameron visited with Major General Dickman, commander of the Eighth corps area, and impressed upon him the necessity for establishing a permanent military post at Douglas, Ariz. General Dickman promised to recommend such a post and do all in his power to bring about its establishment.

Senator Cameron expects to leave for Washington within a few days.
