Jerome will win, unless some serious political mistake is made, it has been a long time since such a storm of public approval fell upon the shoulders of any candidate in New York.

Mobs of indignant citizens charged through the City Hall park, bent upon tearing down the banners and dragging them underfoot. Hundreds of police reserves were called out, and prevented violence.
