Other delegates from New Mexico are to be appointed as follows: The mayor of each city of less than 25,000 population, 5 delegates; the mayor of each city of more than 25,000 population, 10 delegates; each board of county commissioners, 5 delegates; each chamber of commerce, board of trade, commercial club, or real estate exchange, 2 delegates; each organized irrigation, agricultural or live stock association, 2 delegates; each society of engineers, 2 delegates; each irrigation company, 1 delegate; each agricultural college, and each college or university having chairs of hydraulic engineering or forestry, 2 delegates.


