RAILROAD SHOPS
FOR TOWN OF
CIMARRON

Lumber and Other Interests
Causing Rapid Growth
of Population.

Cimarron, N. M., Sept. 18.—(Special.)—W. H. Jackson, of Alamogordo, N. M., is here looking up the lumber interests of this place. He visited the lumber tracts of the Penitentiary last week and reports the portion of the territory able to furnish the finest logging prospects in the southwest. He is negotiating the purchase of an interest in the Cimarron Lumber company.

W. K. Christie, who has been connected with the St. Louis, Rocky Mountain & Pacific railroad for the past two years, has resigned his position and is here and reports the portion of the territory able to furnish the finest logging prospects in the southwest. He is negotiating the purchase of an interest in the Cimarron Lumber company.

The public schools here opened last week with a large enrollment. Miss Margaret Cavanaugh, Miss Marjiam Ellis, and Miss Mable King, constitute the corps of teachers. The crowded condition of the hotels of this town is evidence of the boom which Cimarron is experiencing. The St. James, under the management of John Duquette, the Swastika, managed by Mrs. Savary, the Livingston hotel, managed by Mrs. Livingston and daughters, and the Oxford, managed by W. B. Marling, with a total capacity of more than one hundred guests, have been nightly turning away guests.

The Cimarron National bank is erecting a fine bank building on Ninth street, just across from the park. The building will be two stories high, 50 by 80 feet. Henry S. Allison, who was assistant chief clerk of the last session of the legislature, has been engaged by the Raton Range to do editorial work on the Cimarron News and Press, which is published by the Range Printing company.

With the building of the machine shops and round house of the C. & N. W. railway here, the town will have a large population of railroad men. The St. Louis, Rocky Mountain & Pacific has already a large force of men employed in the shops of that road which are located here.
