Official Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.
Santa Fe, N. M., January 4, 1898.—The honorable board of county commissioners met at 1:30 o'clock p. m. as per adjournment. Present: Hon. C. W. Dudrow, chairman and Honorables Jose Amador Lucero and J. T. McLaughlin, commissioners, and Atanasio Romero, clerk.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved.

In accordance with the law the period of two days was fixed as the time for work on public roads in the different precincts of the county by all persons required to do so, or to furnish teams for such purpose during the year 1898, and the clerk was directed to so inform all the justices of the peace of the different precincts of the county, being as the justices of the peace are ex officio road overseers according to the laws of 1897.

The following resolution was introduced and adopted:
It appearing to the board of county commissioners that it will be for the best interest of the county and in order to

induce delinquent taxpayers to pay taxes due, there be and it is hereby Resolved, That the collector of taxes for the county of Santa Fe be and hereby is authorized and directed to receive all delinquent taxes due and delinquent up to and including the year 1895, 75 per centum of the amount of such taxes due and delinquent being for the years 1892, 1893 inclusive, giving his official receipt for such 75 per centum in full for said taxes and abating the amount of 25 per cent hereby authorized, provided that all such taxes due and delinquent for the years above specified be and are paid during the present month and are paid in or before the first day of February, 1898.

H. C. Reed was appointed justice of the peace of precinct No. 20.
The following resolution was duly adopted:
Resolved, That the chairman of this board and the clerk thereof be and the said two officers are hereby authorized and directed to destroy and burn the warrants and coupons paid and redeemed by the county treasurer up to January 1, 1898, and filed with this board and also all refunded bonds and coupons which may have been refunded during the years past and up to January 1, 1898, and which are now in the possession of this board.

The board then proceeded to the examination of the accounts for the year 1897, of H. B. Cartwright, county treasurer, and the accounts were found correct and in accordance with law, and the following report of the county treasurer was approved and audited and ordered spread upon the minutes of this board. The following is the report of the county clerk for 1897.

The clerk was directed to notify all the justices of the peace of the different precincts of the county to file in this office a bond in the sum of \$300 as justices of the peace and ex officio road overseers according to law of 1897, and the same to be approved by this board.

The board adjourned subject to the call of the chairman.
